A word from the Manager:

“Charlton Rovers Reserves’ cup run began last September with a game in the Forest of Dean against Soudley. This was a close match with our team having to withstand a lot of pressure from the home side, but a couple of goals from Jordan Cooper and a converted penalty from Tom Morgan gave us a 3-2 victory.

In Round Two, we were drawn to play Stonehouse Town Thirds but our opponents were unable to fulfil the fixture and so we were awarded a walkover.

Round Three saw us face Tewkesbury Town Reserves at our home ground at Balcarras School in December. Playing some excellent football, we secured a well-deserved 2-0 win with a brace of goals from Harvey Collins.

Our quarter final game in January was also at home against Abbeymead Rovers Reserves. Two goals from Tom Hannah and one from Ellis Rattue gave us a 3-1 lead at half time. Abbeymead dug deep in the second half though and scored a couple of goals to end the game 3-3. Holding our nerve in the penalty shoot-out, we scored four goals compared with Abbeymead’s two to clinch the victory.

We drew Chalford Thirds at home in the semi-final. The game was played on February 19th, the day after the great storm that hit the country. A soggy pitch and strong winds made for difficult playing conditions but both teams performed well. We conceded an early goal but managed to equalise with a penalty converted by Kemall Harrison just before half time. A great second half performance by all our players gave us the advantage and we managed to secure a 3-1 victory with Tom Hannah scoring with an intricate finish in the opposition’s penalty area followed by a wonder strike from the half-way line by Adam Slade.”

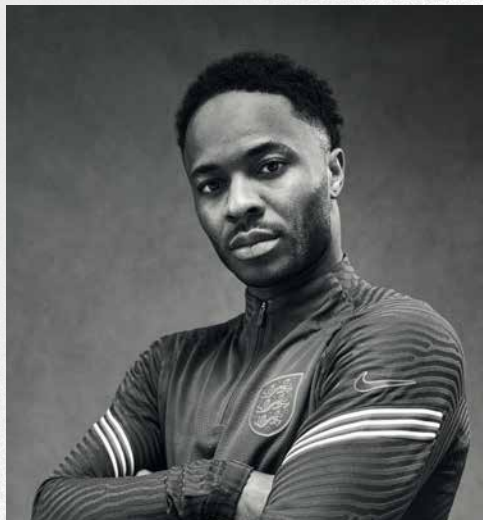
