WOTTON ROVERS

A word from the secretary:

"Wotton's road to the final started back on a fine September day when they trekked up the Wye Valley to play in a most scenic venue overlooking the river in the village of Redbrook. Redbrook, of the Premier Division of the North Gloucestershire League, put up a good fight but eventually Wotton were too strong and ran out 5-2 winners.

In Round 2 Wotton were at home to another team from a higher division, Quedgeley Wanderers Res of the Stroud League Division 1. Quedgeley didn't know what hit them and were trounced 8-0 in a game which included a Joe Stokes hat-trick.

Next up were Tredworth Tigers, top of Stroud League Division 1, so this game was effectively a game between the eventual Champions of Stroud League Division 1 and Division 2. But it was the Division 2 Champions Wotton Rovers that won out on penalties after a 1-1 draw.

The Quarter Finals brought FC Lakeside Res from The Cheltenham League Division 1 (South) to Synwell and yet another higher division scalp was taken by Rovers with a 2-1 win.

In the Semi-Final Wotton had to travel to the runaway leaders and eventual Champions of Cheltenham League Division 1 (South), Fintan FC. At the time Fintan could boast a 100% winning record and looked to be heading for the final as they took a 2-0 lead at half time. But the second half saw Wotton's skill and determination start to tell and two late goals by Nat Herbert left the teams level at 90 minutes. But it was Wotton who won the spot kicks 5-3 to progress to the final.

It's 40 years since Wotton Rovers last won a County Cup. On that occasion it was the Senior Amateur Cup when they beat St Marks CA. Also, another interesting fact is that the first ever winners of today's competition was Wotton in 1913-14.

This evening Wotton are hoping to add the Junior Cup (North) to League Championship to make it a truly memorable season."

CHELTENHAM CIVIL SERVICE RESERVES

"As Cheltenham Civil Service Reserves head into the final weeks of the 2021/22 season, they are on the verge of the most successful campaign in the team's history.



Crowned champions of Cheltenham League Division One North in early March, the title was

secured after winning all but one of their games. With two games left to play they lead the table by 13 points with a goal difference of +61 from just 14 matches.

Under the management of Dan Midwinter, their success in the league has been mirrored in cup competitions. At the time of writing, in addition to winning through to the Junior County Cup final, the team have reached the final of the Cheltenham League Senior Charities Cup competition and have a semi-final in the Junior Charities Cup to look forward too.

With a potential quadruple on the cards, the team will record their, and the club's, most successful season ever if they win the lot.

The journey to the final:

Cheltenham Civil Service Reserves saw their defence breached just once on the way to the final, winning all their ties in the regulation 90 minutes.

Entering the competition in the second round, a Dan Wills double helped the team beat Cam Bulldogs 5-1 in round two, as they conceded their only goal on their route to the final.

With third round opponents Ramblers disbanding, the team then had a walkover into the quarter-final where they faced a strong Minchinhampton side. It proved to be one of their toughest games of the season but, after weathering the pressure in the first half, goals from

Bobby Greenwood and Scott Edginton secured their place in the semi-final.

Facing Kingswood North in the semi-final, an impressive first half display saw Service go into the half time break with a 2-0 lead. Dan Wills scored both goals, mirror image strike into the corner that left the keeper helpless.

Service then withstood some second half pressure, and with no further goals in the games, booked their place in the final."
