# DURSLEY TOWN LADIES



“AHEAD of the 2021/22 season, Dursley Town Ladies could scarcely have believed that their 20th anniversary would be marked with the most exciting campaign of their two-decade existence.

This season, all expectations have been wildly exceeded under the guidance of management team Suze Stanley-Greaves, George Greaves and coach Stephanie ‘Biff’ Hill.

Not only have Dursley reached the GFA Women’s Trophy final, but they will also contest next month’s Gordon Perrett League Cup final, while they pushed the vastly-better-resourced Bristol Rovers Development all the way in the Division Two title race.

Key to Town’s success so far this term has been the 26-goal haul of Morgan Tayler, although dead-ball specialist Lucy Jones (15 goals) and skipper Michelle Watson (8 goals) have contributed significantly too.

At the other end of the pitch, club stalwart Jodie Turl has had a terrific season in goal behind a solid defence and midfield unit featuring Emma Allen, Stacey Drew, Hannah Daniels, Sophie O’Neill, Vicki Grimshaw, Gemma Butler, Louise Pegler, Georgina Macey and Lucy Roseblade.

Young forward Phoebe Booth has impressed during her first season of senior football, while newcomers Sally Whitlock and Hannah Morgan, and long-serving squad members Chanelle Uzzell and Aine Redmond have also played their part.

In the League, defeats to Tuffley and Bristol Rovers in the opening four fixtures were offset by victories against Cheltenham Civil Service (9-3) and Ellwood (6-0), Tayler scoring five times in both matches.

Dursley really hit form from mid-November, though, winning ten games in a row in all competitions, including one walkover, while Division One sides Bristol & West and Bishop’s Cleeve were dispatched on the way to the Gordon Perrett Cup final.

Dursley did the double over today’s opponents Cirencester in the League, winning 2-1 away thanks to Tayler and Watson, while Jones, Tayler and Whitlock netted in the 3-1 home triumph.

To reach today’s Trophy final, Winchcombe were beaten 4-3, a 4-1 quarter-final victory over Whitchurch & Bristol, and 2-1 in the semi-final against Red Falcon at Oaklands Park.”

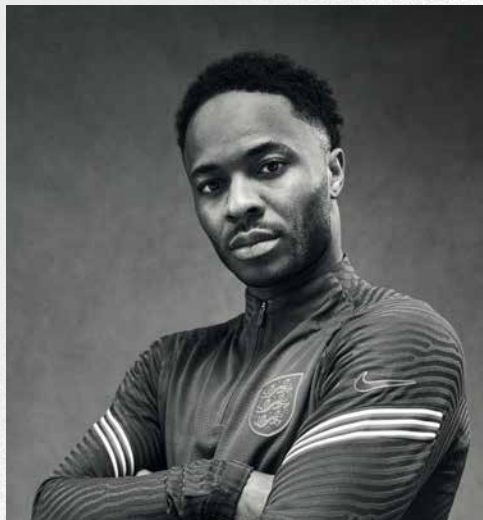
