Season so far

The 2022-23 season has certainly been a topsy turvy affair. A slow start saw 2 points from out 1 st 2 games which were either side of a 4-2 defeat to Southern League Kidlington in the FA Cup. After 3 heavy defeats we eventually picked up out first win at the end of August with a 3-2 away win at Hereford Pegasus. Home supporters had to wait until mid-September to see a win with the 2-1 defeat of Longlevens. This was followed by a very good 5-1 FA Vase victory over Western League Hengrove Athletic. The prize for this victory was a home tie against high flying Western League Mousehole who inflicted a 3-1 defeat on us. An indifferent run following the FA Vase exit saw three consecutive losses, but then in an upsurge of form, saw 7 points gained from the next three games. At the start of December, after a 1 st Round Bye, we finally swung into GFA Challenge Cup action with an away trip to Cadbury Heath, coming back with a 3-1 win. Ten points in the first two months of 2023 saw the club in the bottom three and flirting with relegation, although one of these victories was a critical 3-0 win at fellow strugglers Thornbury Town.

The end of February saw us again swing into County Cup action with an away Quarter Final game against Hellenic Division One side Bourton Rovers. In a feisty affair where not much football was played, a 1-0 win was achieved although, on the downside, a serious injury to Liam Sheppard saw his season finished! This was further compounded the following week with a bad injury to 1 st Team regular Harry Clark, an injury that puts him also out for the rest of the season. Late March saw the semi-final against Tuffley Rovers and, at last, a home tie. With the league game against the same opponents finishing 1-1 the previous week, we knew this would be a close affair, and so it turned out to be, but goals from Jamie Addis & Lewis Thompson gave us a 2-1 win, although the hero of the day was keeper Richard Thomas who saved a penalty when the score was 2-1. This win sees us through to a Cup Final date with old adversaries Roman Glass St. George. This will be Lydney Towns 2 nd appearance in the Challenge Trophy Final, having been beaten by Bristol Manor Farm in 2016. Having reached our 1st Cup Final since 2017, our priorities switched to ensuring our Hellenic Premier Division status and crucial wins away against fellow strugglers Hereford Lads Club & amp; then at home to Shrivenham secured our Premier Division status for the 9th season running. To top the season of a 2 nd Cup Final appearance has been achieved this time in the Bluefin Sports Challenge Cup. A 1 st round 3-1 win at Kidlington Res was followed by a tremendous 2-1 win over Westfields. This win was surpassed by an even more impressive 1-0 win away to highflying Malvern Town courtesy of a Charlie Powell goal. The semi-final saw the visit of Royal Wootton Bassett to the Rec. Goals from Lewis Thompson, Jaheim Allen & Jordi Sheen saw us 3-0 up on the hour mark, but two goals from the visitors made it a nervous finish. The Final is four days after the GFA Challenge Cup Final on Monday, May 1st, at Westfields FC, Hereford, so the club looks forward to an exciting few days to end the 2022-23 season.
