COMPETITION NAME

The competition shall be known as the Priaux League and shall fall under the jurisdiction of the Guernsey Football League Management LBG (GFLM) and be subject to sanction by the Guernsey Football Association LBG.

ENTRY

The competition shall be open to clubs that competed in that competition in the previous season and to any other affiliated club whose entry is accepted by the GFLM Board of Directors.

TROPHIES AND MEDALS

The winner of the Competition will be presented with the Priaux League Trophy.

The winning club shall be provided with 16 medals of a standard pattern purchased by the GFLM at such cost as the GFLM may determine, one of which is to be presented to the Team Manager. Names of all recipients shall be given to the GFLM Fixtures Secretary prior to presentation.

A club is not permitted to present a league winners' medal to any player who has not represented that club in at least one-third of the number of matches played by that club in the relevant league competition.

The GFLM may sanction the presentation of league winners' medals to additional players (i.e. more than 16 players per club) provided that such players are eligible under this bye law and provided that the players' club has applied in writing for such extra medals and has agreed to meet all of the costs associated with the purchase and inscription of such extra medals.

In exceptional circumstances, the provisions of the bye law regarding the presentation of medals may be relaxed by the GFLM upon receipt of application in writing from any club.

The winners' medal shall be obtained and paid for by the GFLM who shall determine the design and quality of such medals.

PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

The Priaux League shall be an open age competition and therefore will be open to all players, who are eligible under the SCOR, and who have attained the age 16 years.

MATCH DURATION

The duration of matches shall be 90 minutes, consisting of two equal halves of 45 minutes each way.

COMPETITION FORMAT

The competition will be played in a league format, with clubs split into a number of divisions as determined by the Board of Directors. In the Priaux League clubs shall play each other home and away each season as a minimum, but depending on club entries the number of fixtures may be increased which will be determined by the GFLM on an annual basis. Three points being awarded for a win, one point for a draw and no points for a loss.

In the event of a tie in points for leadership at the end of a season, the competition will be determined in accordance with the SCOR.

PITCH AND GOAL DIMENSIONS

The pitch and goal dimensions shall be as laid out in the IFAB Laws of the Game, Law 1 – The Field of Play, for senior football and shall be:

Length: Minimum 90 metres Maximum 120 metres

Width: Minimum 45 metres Maximum 90 metres.

The Length of the Touch Line must always be greater than the Length of the goal line

Goal: Width 7.32 metres and height 2.44 metres

PLAYERS AND SUBSTITUTES

The Priaulx League is classified as Step 7 and as such, 3 substitute players may be used who may be selected from a maximum of 7 players.

The team with the second fewest points in Division 1 and the team with the second most points in Divisions 2 will compete in a single play-off match at a neutral venue whereby the winning team is placed into Division 1 and the losing team into Division 2 for the following season.

The winning club(s) shall be provided with 18 medals of a standard pattern purchased by the GFLM at such cost as the GFLM may determine, one of which is to be presented to the Team Manager. Names of all recipients shall be given to the GFLM Fixtures Secretary prior to presentation.

A club is not permitted to present a winners' medal to any player who has not represented that club in at least one-third of the number of matches played by that club in the relevant league competition.

The GFLM may sanction the presentation of winners' medals to additional players (i.e. more than 18 players per club) provided that such players are eligible under this bye law and provided that the players' club has applied in writing for such extra medals and has agreed to meet all of the costs associated with the purchase and inscription of such extra medals.

The first phase of the competition will be played in a league format and clubs shall play each other home and away, with three points being awarded for a win, one point for a draw and no points for a loss.

In the event of a tie in points for qualifying leagues positions at the end of the first phase of the competition, final positions will be decided upon by aggregating the results of the two matches between the tied clubs. If clubs are still tied, the teams shall play an extra play-off match or matches as decided by the Board of Directors in order to determine the final positions. The teams placed first through to fourth will compete for the Corbet Cup and the teams placed fifth and below will compete for the Corbet Plate.

The second phase of the competition will be a knock-out with the team finishing in first place in the league format playing the team finishing fourth and the team finishing second playing the team finishing third in two semi-finals with the winners contesting the Corbet Cup final.

In the knock out phase of the Competition if the match ends in a draw at the end of normal time, extra-time of 10 minutes each way shall be played. If the tie ends in a draw after extra-time, the tie shall be decided by the taking of penalty kicks. This shall also apply to the Finals (Corbet Cup & Corbet Cup Shield).

The finals shall be held at the Corbet Field.
