

School Club Link Questions and Answers

Question:

I have tried to contact the local school/club we are targeting for the link, but have not been able to get through to the right person/arrange a meeting. What should I do?

Answer:

Both Teachers and club committee members are extremely busy people and this should be recognised from the outset. School hours are often not compatible with club hours due to the fact that most clubs are run by volunteers, many of whom have a fulltime job during the day. At least one meeting will need to take place to agree the plans for the link. In order to achieve this both the club and school must be flexible in terms of dates/times to meet. If you are unable to get through to the right person at the club/school please contact Berks and Bucks FA

Question:

The club coach is not available to deliver session after school or during school hours as they work full time. How can we set up a school club links?

Answer:

You could consider utilising school sport leaders or independent paid coaches to deliver the link sessions. Berks & Bucks FA School Club Link funding may be able to support you

How can I ensure that the club/coaches involved offer a safe sports environment?

Answer:

Ideally your targeted club will have Charter Standard (Club Mark) if the club does not have Charter Standard please contact Berks & Bucks FA for advice on how to proceed. Coaches involved in the link must be suitably qualified and should be observed by a member of school staff. The school will need to assure itself that the club it is linking to is well managed.

Do you have any examples of the tangible things that can occur in a good school/club link?

School circulates club information on forthcoming activities/events to all or selected year groups and vice versa

- Use of school/club notice boards, newletters, website to advertise activities/events
- Individual and team successes celebrated in school assemblies
- Club activates fundraise for PTA or vice-versa or joint funding applications
- Club facility and equipment used to host events for schools and or feeder primaries or vice-versa
- Participation in school club link days
