ST ALBANS CITY YOUTH FOOTBALL CLUB-50TH ${ }^{\text {T }}$ ANNIVERSARY TOURNAMENT 2021 BOYS \& GIRLS SMALL SIDED COMPETITION RULES

1. The competition shall be known as the 'St. Albans City Youth FC Small Sided Competition' and shall be affiliated to the Hertfordshire County Football Association. Entry is by invitation only and the competition will be conducted in accordance with the rules, regulations, and bylaws of the Football Association.
2. The competition shall be designated as for the Under 7, Under 8, Under 9, Under 10, Under 11 and Under 12 age groups. Age qualification dates are as follows:

Under 7 Boys \& Girls who were under 7 years old on 31 August 2021
Under 8 Boys \& Girls who were under 8 years old on 31 August 2021
Under 9 Boys \& Girls who were under 9 years old on 31 August 2021
Under 10 Boys \& Girls who were under 10 years old on 31 August 2021
Under 11 Boys \& Girls who were under 11 years old on 31 August 2021
Under 12 Boys \& Girls who were under 12 years old on 31 August 2021
No team shall include players with an age differential of more than two years. The entrance fee is shown on the application form and shall be forfeited by any team withdrawing after the closing date.
3. All competition players shall be deemed to be registered members of the club they represent at the time of the competition. Each registered player shall only play for one team.
4. In case of members still attending school, the first loyalty of each member is to his/her school. If the school requires a member of an affiliated club to play for the school at any time, the club or competition must without question whatsoever release him/her to play for the school. All members still attending school must first obtain clearance from their Head Teacher, in accordance with Football Association Rules. As it is the right of parents to determine whether or not a boy/girl plays in Sunday football registered by County FA's, Head Teachers' permission is not required for such registered activities played on Sundays.
5. The Laws of Association Football will apply except where provided for in the PLAYING RULES.
6. The competition will provide all match balls. The Under 7 's, 8 's, 9 's and 10 's will play with a size 3 and the under 11's and 12 's, with a size 4.
7. Each team shall appoint an adult as a manager. The manager shall be responsible for the team being registered by the correct time as notified by the competition organisers and being available to play on the correct pitch at the notified time.
8. The competition shall provide each participating club with a copy of the competition and playing rules and a copy of their sanction to play the competition from the Herts. County Football Association. No club or team shall be allowed to play unless it is in possession of the above copies.
9. Any protest arising from eligibility or qualification of players, or the interpretation of rules, or any other matter not covered elsewhere in these rules shall be referred to the Organising Committee whose decision shall be final in all matters (subject to rule 10).
10. In the event of any dispute concerning this competition, appeals can be logged with the Hertfordshire Football Association Ltd. In accordance with the rules of that body.
11. Each team is expected to have a qualified first aider in attendance together with a suitable first aid kit.

Unless specified the normal Laws of Association Football will apply
12. Under 7's and Under 8's a maximum of five (5) players will form a team that will consist of a goalkeeper and four (4) outfield players. Under 7's and Under 8's will have a maximum squad size of $\mathbf{1 0}$.
13. Under 9's to Under 12's a maximum of seven (7) players will form a team that will consist of a goalkeeper and six (6) outfield players. Under 9's to Under 12's will have a maximum squad size of $\mathbf{1 2}$ players.
14. Three substitutes may be used in any match from those registered prior to the start of the competition. A player who has been substituted during a match becomes a substitute and may in turn replace another player at any time, subject to the substitution being carried out in accordance with Law 3 of the Laws of Association Football.

## 15. There shall be no offside.

16. A player who is sent off for misconduct shall not be permitted to take any further part in the competition. The player may be replaced for subsequent matches but not in the match that they were sent off in. If a player should receive a second yellow card in separate games he/she will not be permitted to play in his/her teams next game after the one in which the second yellow card was issued. Registered referees shall control all matches and any misconduct shall be reported to the appropriate county FA.
17. The competition shall be played on an initial league basis for all age groups.

Three points for a win, one for a draw.
The team finishing first and second in their group will qualify for the knockout stage.
If two or more teams finish with the same number of points, goal difference will determine the winner.
If goal difference is the same, the team that has scored the most goals will be the winner.
If still equal, kicks from the penalty mark will decide.
In the knockout stage, if the score is equal after normal time, extra time will be played.
If the score is still equal after extra time, kicks from the penalty mark will decide the winner.
18. Duration of matches will be twelve(12) minutes one way.

There will be no half time.
In knockout ties, five (5) minutes extra time will be played if necessary, in the same direction.
19. Kicks from the penalty mark.

Any five of the players who are on the pitch or in goal at the end of play may take a kick for their team. If after both teams have taken five kicks the score is still equal, sudden death will apply.
Should a team consist of less than six players at the end of play, the opposing team will reduce the number of players taking penalties to the same number.
20. All teams must provide two playing strips. In the event of a clash, the first named team will change. All players must wear shin pads or will not be allowed to take part in the tournament.
21. At the start of a game, ends shall be decided by the toss of a coin. Play starts by the referee dropping the ball on the centre mark between a player from both teams who are no less than one metre from the centre mark. The game shall be restarted in the same manner after a goal has been scored.
22. Until a free kick has been taken, the opposition must be at least two metres from the ball.

## 23. Goalkeepers

## Under 7's and Under 8's

Goalkeepers may collect the ball from a back pass from their own players with their hands.
Goalkeepers may kick the ball back or throw the ball back from open play.
Goalkeepers must kick the ball back into play from a goal kick, by placing the ball anywhere on the Goal Area Line. Normal FA rules for Goalkeepers apply at Under 7's and Under 8's.

## Under 9's to Under 12's

Goalkeepers may not collect the ball from a back pass from their own players with their hands.
An indirect free kick will be awarded if a goalkeeper collects the ball with their hands from their own player. Goalkeepers may kick the ball back or throw the ball back from open play.

Goalkeepers must kick the ball back into play from a goal kick, by placing the ball anywhere on the Goal Area Line. Normal FA rules for Goalkeepers apply at Under 9's to Under 12's.

## 24. Head Height Rule

There is no head height rule and the normal FA rules apply across all age groups.

## 25. Retreat Line Rule

## For Under 7, Under 8, Under 9 and Under 10.

When the goalkeeper restarts play from a dead ball goal kick, the opposition players must retreat to their own half until the ball is in play. The defending team does not have to wait for the opposition to retreat and has the option to restart the game before should they choose to. The ball is in play when the goalkeeper kicks the ball out of the penalty area.

For Under 11 and Under 12.
There is no retreat line rule, but opposition players must not be in the penalty area of the team taking the goal kick.

## 26. Throw Ins

Normal throw ins from hands will apply at all age groups.
Referees will encourage a second take of a foul throw at the Under 7 \& Under 8 age groups.
27. Kick Off Times

Teams must be ready to start the fixture at the allotted time. Failure to do so will result in the points being awarded to opposing team, or during knock out fixtures, the match awarded to the opposing team.

In the event that both teams are not ready for kick off time, the result will become Null and Void with neither team receiving any points, or during knock out fixtures, the fixture will be null and voided.
