Competition History



This is the 22nd Final of the Hertfordshire FA Women's Challenge Cup

Our Women's Challenge Cup was introduced in the 1999/2000 season with the rise in Women's football, not only in this county but nationwide. Great effort has been put into the promotion of the Women's game over this time and in Hertfordshire we are proud to have been at the forefront of this progression with strong growth in female participation.

The first winners of this competition were Berkhamsted Town Ladies, defeating Welwyn Garden City Ladies 2-0. For the next decade Watford had something of a stranglehold on the cup, winning in eight seasons out of the next nine.

Arsenal's second-string then had a run of three successive victories, before Stevenage established their period of dominance in this competition, appearing in each of the the last six finals to be played, winning four. Royston have featured in three previous finals and will be hoping to add their name to the trophy for the first time today.

Today's match will be 45 minutes each way, with kicks from the penalty mark if necessary.

Recent Finals

The COVID pandemic caused the 2019/20 season to be cut short, with winning semi finalists Stevenage and Watford declared to have shared the competition. The Women's Cup was not run in the 2020/21 season before returning last year.

Holders aiming to maintain their grip on this competition and lift the cup for a fifth time

Founded as Stevenage Boro Ladies in 2001 and in 2014 moved under the umbrella of Stevenage FC Foundation, we later dropped the 'Boro' in in line with the parent club to became Stevenage Ladies, before rebranding as Stevenage FC Women in 2019.

Over the years the women's squads have continued to grow and gone from strength to strength on the field. In 2009 we managed to create a reserve setup to help bring young players into adult football and through into the first team.

In our relatively short history both teams have been very successful, winning leagues and gaining promotions as well as lifting many cups, including the County Cup four times since 2015 as well as sharing it with Watford after the COVID outbreak.

Currently the first team are playing in the Eastern Region Women's Football League, Premier Division, while the Development setup play in the Women's National League Reserve South East and Central Division.

Give us your analysis of the season so far...

The season started inconsistently for Boro. An opening day victory was followed by a defeat and then a draw in a landmark home game played at the Lamex Stadium. We then on a positive run that secured six wins out of the next eight games up to the Christmas break, whilst scoring an impressive 36 goals.

The New Year began in similar fashion, with two disappointing defeats, on the road, progression to the County Cup final, and a solitary league win in January.

However, a comeback victory at home to runaway leaders Luton Town was followed by three huge victories in the league that saw us top the table, albeit having played more games than those around them.

A defeat to Needham Market handed the momentum to the chasing pack, but a recent quarter final victory has set up a tasty semi final against the aforementioned Needham in the League Cup. Whilst the promotion hopes are out of the hands of Stevenage, the chance of a cup double is a salivating prospect for all of Boro's fans.

The club's joint second highest goalscorer of the current crop of players, most of her goals came in her award-winning season last year. Two goals and one assist this year added to her tally.

Jodie Bellinger

A no-nonsense forward who has tripled her number of club goals this season thanks in part to a stunning hat trick in the County Cup game against Wodson. Jodie has also contributed four assists to the cause.

Club look to add County Cup success to their many League and League Cup honours

The team began life in 1998/99 playing under the name of Heath Sports and were managed by Graham Phillips (who at the time was also Secretary of RTFC). Heath Sports changed their name and became part of Royston Town Football Club and over the years were consistent performers in the Eastern Region Women's Football League.

Current boss Lewis Endacott was appointed manager of the Women's team in 2013 and that season marked the start of a successful period where we finished runner up in the ERWFL Division 1, League Plate Winners, County Cup Runners Up. In the 2014/15 season we finished runners up in the league for the second season running, whilst retaining the League Plate and finishing runners up in the League Cup.

Whilst there was no cup success in 2015/16, we improved our league campaign by winning the ERWFL Division 1 and gaining promotion to the ERWFL Premier. Since then we have established ourselves as a competitive side in the division, finishing runners up in 2021/22, narrowly missing out on promotion. Other honours in this time include County Cup runners up 2016/17, ERWFL Challenge Cup Winners 2020/21.


Chris Geelan (Fourth Official)
