Competition History

This is the 87th Final of the Hertfordshire FA Under 18 Boys Challenge Cup



The Under 18 Challenge Cup was originally administered by the Hertfordshire Minor FA, which was a separate organisation before later becoming the Hertfordshire County Youth FA and then merging with Hertfordshire FA in 1998.

Having first been played in 1931, today's match will be the 87th final of this competition, with several years lost during the war when the competition was suspended, another in 1983 when the final was not played and then two further years due to the pandemic.

While six different clubs have recorded back to back wins in this competition down the years, few have ever established any significant periods of dominance. The exception being Letchworth Boys Club, who won four of the first eight finals played.

Cheshunt lifted the trophy three times in five years just after the Second World War and will be looking to add a fourth win today. Hemel Hempstead Town are seeking their second win, having previously secured the cup in 2005. However, the most successful club in this competition is Carlton, with a total of five wins spread between 1948 and 1975.

Today's match will be 45 minutes each way, with kicks from the penalty mark if necessary.

Recent Finals

The COVID pandemic caused the 2019/20 season to be cut short, with that season's competition being declared void. The Under 18 Boys Cup was not run in the subsequent season before returning last year.

Club Profile Cheshunt Youth

Providing a pathway from youth football into the adult game



Cheshunt FC were founded in 1946, consisting of a first team at senior level and a reserve team. They also run a very successful juniors Under 18 and minors at Under 16. During the 1950s these teams disappeared for reasons that are since lost to time.

In July 1966 Cheshunt Youth where founded, a completely different entity to the main Cheshunt Football Club, playing in yellow shirts and royal blue shorts and socks. This youth club went from strength to strength and added age groups along the way, with teams winning various leagues and cups across the seasons.

In the early 1970s Cheshunt FC invited Cheshunt Youth FC to be amalgamated with the senior club and in doing so Cheshunt FC became one of the largest clubs in Non-League football. In the years that have followed the club have been extremely successful at all age groups, winning Leagues, Cups and County Cups.

The club now runs teams from Under 6 to Under 18. During this time the club has produced a number of players that have gone onto play professional football, Ian Dowie, Paul Marquis, Rueben Agboola, Tommy Fletcher and Jack Midson to name a few.

Give us your analysis of the season so far...

We started pre-season in late July in preparation for our first year representing Cheshunt in the FA Youth Cup. Our squad consisting of first year U18s who were cherishing the challenge of a long and tough season ahead. Our first game was in August against Enfield Town with the boys putting in a strong performance and winning 2-0. We continued in the tournament before finally losing a close contest to Aveley in the third round qualifying.

With the start of the season being postponed due to the death of the Queen, our first league game wasn't then until late September. We started with a home tie against Ware, last year's County Cup winners, which ended in a close fought 3-3 draw. We then went on a solid run putting us in a strong position in the league, ready for the start of our County Cup campaign showing our quality in the early rounds. A loss to Edgeware and Kingsbury in the league was followed by our strongest period of the season winning seven consecutive games.

The quarter final was the toughest game of the cup run, requiring us to come back from 1-0 down with 15 minutes to go. In the semi-final game against Berkhamsted Raiders we hit our form to reach a County Cup final for the second year running and the fourth time in six seasons. Having concluded our league season winning our division and narrowly missing out in our League Cup semi-final against Ware, we are hoping that we can put on a strong performance in the final and end our great season on high. Give us your analysis of the season so far...

A very solid second season from the boys, building on our first season where we ended as the 2022/2023 EJA Challenge Cup winners following six rounds against teams spread across the East of England which culminated in a 4-1 win over Newmarket Town in the final.

League form this season has been excellent, with the boys pushing eventual champions Ware all the way to the final weekend of the season. We went as far as the semi-final of the league cup and were unfortunate to lose 2-1 in a very close match with Heybridge Swifts. However, it is in the County Cup where the boys have really excelled.

After moving past Welwyn Pegasus and Everett Rovers in the early rounds, we then faced a hugely difficult trip to Ware, where after being 1-0 down for the majority of the game we equalised in the 94th minute and then went on to win on penalties.

The semi-final was a much simpler affair with a magnificent footballing display to defeat Ware, who were EJA Champions of Champions from last season by a score of 3-0. Our boys play an attractive brand of football and as a first year U18 side we expect to be even stronger next season and challenging on all fronts in league and cup competitions.

It is always a proud moment to be involved in a County Cup Final and I am looking forward to a great game. As well as refereeing myself I am also involved as an Appointments Officer.


Stephen Hill (Fourth Official)
