# **Competition History**



# This is the 49th Final of the Hertfordshire FA U14 Boys Challenge Cup

The Under 14 Challenge Cup was introduced in 1971/72 alongside an Under 12 competition, reflecting the growth of the youth game. Prior to this there had been the Under 18 Cup which had begun in 1930/31 and an Under 16 Cup since 1945/46.

The inaugural winners were Holywell Boys with their only success in this competition, setting something of a pattern for the future. Indeed so few clubs have been able to secure victory more than once that there have been no less than 39 different winners in 48 years.

It is St Albans City Youth who have been most successful in bucking this trend, getting their name on the trophy four times between 1982 and 2006. Of today's finalists Cheshunt will be looking to add a third victory, having previously won in 2003 and 2014, while Ware will be looking for their second win having lifted the trophy in 2018.

Today's match will be 35 minutes each way, with kicks from the penalty mark if necessary. Teams are permitted roll-on/roll-off substitutes.

# **Recent Finals**

The COVID pandemic caused the 2019/20 season to be cut short, with winning semi-finalists Bishops Stortford and Cheshunt declared to have shared the competition. The U14 Boys Challenge Cup was not run in the subsequent two seasons.

# New facilities have helped historic club build its pathway for development

Ware FC – originally called Ware Town and known locally as The Blues – was established in 1892 and is based at Wodson Park on the edge of town. The club moved there from its previous Buryfield ground in 1995, with the 3G pitch being installed in 2018. The capacity of the ground is 3,300 and the first team play in the Southern League Central Division.

The performance of the first team in recent seasons along with the benefits of year-round football on the 3G pitch is inspiring all those who play for the club. This facility also helps with attracting players and we draw from a wide area locally which has supported our growth. This year we are proud to have 39 teams in operation from U7 upwards.

This includes the U13-U18 who play in the Eastern Junior Alliance League. With several boys from the EJA setup now regulars with the club's first team, we have a clear pathway for young talent to progress all the way to senior football. This is the 11th season the club have played in the league, with all six teams competing strongly across all competitions.

#### Gianluca Moliterno


Gianluca is technically good on the ball he is always looking to create and find the opportunity to score a goal. Gianluca can play anywhere in attack and always gives his all for the team.

# Club Profile Cheshunt Youth

# Providing a pathway from youth football into the adult game



Cheshunt FC were founded in 1946, consisting of a first team at senior level and a reserve team. They also run a very successful juniors Under 18 and minors at Under 16. During the 1950s these teams disappeared for reasons that are since lost to time.

In July 1966 Cheshunt Youth where founded, a completely different entity to the main Cheshunt Football Club, playing in yellow shirts and royal blue shorts and socks. This youth club went from strength to strength and added age groups along the way, with teams winning various leagues and cups across the seasons.

In the early 1970s Cheshunt FC invited Cheshunt Youth FC to be amalgamated with the senior club and in doing so Cheshunt FC became one of the largest clubs in Non-League football. In the years that have followed the club have been extremely successful at all age groups, winning Leagues, Cups and County Cups.

The club now runs teams from Under 6 to Under 18. During this time the club has produced a number of players that have gone onto play professional football, Ian Dowie, Paul Marquis, Rueben Agboola, Tommy Fletcher and Jack Midson to name a few.
