Competition History



This is the 94th Final of the Hertfordshire FA Charity Shield and the first to take place since 2019

The Hertfordshire FA Charity Competitions have long been an opportunity for the football community in the county to come together raise funds for worthy local causes and tonight's final continues a tradition dating back to the start of the last century.

The proceeds from matches played in these two competitions are collected and distributed to charities nominated by the competition finalists. The top eight clubs in the county (with the current exception of Watford, Stevenage and Boreham Wood) are invited to contest the Charity Cup, with the next sixteen entering the Charity Shield.

The Charity Shield was first played in the 1919-20 season, with the inaugural winners being Hertford Town who defeated Letchworth Town 3-1 in front of over 1,200 spectators at Hatfield United's ground. The Shield was presented by the Marquess of Salisbury, James Gascoyne-Cecil, whose ancestral home was, and still remains, at Hatfield House.

Hertford Town remain the most successful club in this competition, with a total of seven wins down the years, the most recent of which was in 2015. Both of tonight's finalists also have a strong record in the Charity Shield, with Oxhey Jets having won three times in a four year period from 2010 onward, while Tring Athletic have four wins to their name.

Today's match will be 45 minutes each way, with kicks from the penalty mark if necessary. Teams may use five substitutes from a list of five provided to the referee before kick off.

Club Profile Tring Athletic



From roots as a youth football club over sixty years ago to the last sixteen of the FA Vase

Tring Athletic Youth was formed in 1958 to provide football for those under the age of 21 and despite playing against adult teams won many trophies in the West Herts Saturday League during the early 1960s including the Division 1 title three times in five years.

We then went through a lean spell and in 1971 decided to scrap the upper age limit and drop youth from our name. Many former players returned, and another successful period on the pitch followed. A few years later however, our Miswell Lane ground was sold to the local council and without the efforts of a few loyal members we would have certainly folded.

We decided to turn to youth again and gradually forced our way back up through the leagues and by 1986 we were competing in the Premier Division and running a Reserve side again, before reaching the Spartan South Midlands League in 1998.

The 1999-2000 season turned out to be the most successful in the Club's history, as in addition to winning the Senior Division title by 11 points we also reached five finals, winning three, including the Hertfordshire FA Charity Shield and Centenary Trophy.

The 2018-19 season was another highlight, reaching the last sixteen of The FA Vase for the first time while the 'A' team set a club record winning the West Herts Premier League and Cup double, losing only one game - the final of the Hertfordshire FA Junior Cup.

Club Profile Oxhey Jets



From beginnings as a youth club to a fixture in the community offering football for all ages

John Elliott BEM formed Oxhey Jets in 1972 and has been the driving force in its development and approach to supporting youngsters in the local community.

Jets were initially an Under 12 team in the South West Herts Youth League, but the club has continued to build and grow through the years and is now an England Football Accredited Club and has a range of football teams for adults and children.

From the first team which plays in the Combined Counties Division One down through to the Academy and youth teams with sides ranging from age 5 to 18 years. Thanks to this longevity, local families now have generations of Jets running through them.

In the 1980s and 1990's Jets progressed through the Herts County Leagues and had tremendous success in the period after the millennium, earning them promotion to the Spartan Division One which was won on their first attempt in 2004-05.

From 2005 through to 2022 Jets played in the Spartan Premier, their best league finish being 3rd in 2012-13, scoring 125 goals and winning 91 points. Changes to the football pyramid moved Jets to the Combined Counties League Division 1 from this season.

Your analysis of the season so far...

We find ourselves solidly in mid-table in the league and the season has been one of rebuilding under the guidance of Dave Barnes and Tom Inch. We have brought in a number of young players into the team and are focusing strongly on local talent.

Overall, results have met expectations and player development through this season has been encouraging. The club were still in range of the playoff places at the turn of the year but the more experienced sides in the league have since widened the gap.

Jets have proved that they up for a challenge and have recorded some excellent results in Cup games this season, most notably with the semi-final win over Colney Heath in this competition and a big victory over Amersham Town in a St Mary's Cup quarter final.

There is a good atmosphere at the club and the players and staff are looking forward to ending the season well and to continuing their progress into next season.


