Competition History



The 123rd Final of the Hertfordshire FA Junior Cup

The Hertfordshire FA Junior Cup was introduced in the 1894-95 season, eight years after the Senior Cup. It had been played continuously ever since, except for five years during the First World War, until the COVID pandemic forced a two year gap without a final.

The inaugural winners were St Albans Reserves, although this is not the same St Albans club that we know today. That team featured a certain George Wagstaffe-Simmons, who would later become Secretary and Chairman of Hertfordshire FA, serving the county for some fifty years as well as being a Football Association Councillor until 1951.

The competition is open to Saturday teams in the lower divisions of their leagues, together with reserve sides of teams playing in the Intermediate Cup. Given the structure of the competition it is perhaps not surprising that it has produced a wide variety of winners.

The most successful club in this competition are Haileybury, having won on six occasions. No other club has more than three wins and of the 92 different names on the trophy, 72 of them appear just once. Sarratt will be looking to add to that number today, with Swifts aiming to lift the trophy for a second time having previously won in 1972.

Today's match will be 45 minutes each way, with kicks from the penalty mark to decide the winner if necessary. Teams are permitted rolling substitutions from a list of 5 named players.

Recent Finals

The COVID pandemic caused the 2019-20 season to be cut short, with that season's competition being declared void. The Junior Cup was not run in the 2020-21 season.

Club Profile

Sarratt



Founded after the First World War the club has stood the test of time in the local game

Sarratt Football Club was founded in 1919 after local men returned from the First World War. In those days the club had more committee members and vice-presidents than players! In 1923 the team joined the West Herts League and in 1935 the club moved to its current home ground, King George V Playing Fields.

The club resumed play in 1947 after the Second World War, entering the Watford & District League, before rejoining the West Herts League in 1958. During the 1960-61 season the First Team enjoyed their first major accolade, winning the West Herts League First Division.

A pavilion was built at King George throughout 1977-78, the same season the club joined the Herts Senior County League. The First Team won the Division Two title in 1979-80.

The Reserve team has achieved several honours, including winning the Herts Senior County League Reserve Division Two in 2006-07 and Reserve Division One in both 2013-14 and 2015-16, as well as lifting the Cecil Hudson Cup in 2016-17.

The First Team joined the Spartan South Midlands Football League in 2018-19. The Reserve team currently play in Division Three of the Herts Senior County League.

Your analysis of the season so far...

Following an excellent fifth-placed finish in Division 3 last season, narrowly missing out on promotion by only five points, reaching Division 2 was the target at the start of this 2023-24 season. After receiving a 4-1 thrashing at home on opening day, we went on a five game winning streak in the league, scoring an impressive 26 goals during this stretch.

Cemented in the promotion spots, poor weather played havoc with our season during the winter, with only four league matches played between November and January.

Since the turn of the year, we have been enjoying a run of great form, tasting defeat only once (as of the time of writing in mid-March). As it stands we remain on course to finish in the top three, with several matches in hand over our promotion rivals.

The positive league campaign, coupled with a brilliant County Cup run (scoring 16 goals over three matches) have both contributed to an exciting season which is far from over.

Club Profile Bishop's Stortford Swifts



From a group of enthusiastic young players to a club which continues to thrive 70 years on

Bishop's Stortford Swifts were formed in 1953 by a group of 13 year old lads, including current Vice Chairman Peter Hunt, Derek Smith, Eddie Miller, Mick Thurley, and John Sewell with Ron Nott joining a few years later.

Due to their age, they were only able to play friendlies until joining the Bishop's Stortford & District League in 1956. The club moved to their current ground at Silver Leys in 1964 and were founding members of the Essex Olympian League in 1966, winning the Senior Cup in their first season. A reserve side was introduced in 1970.

Several Bishop's Stortford Swifts players have also graced the professional ranks, including ex-Queens Park Rangers and Rushden & Diamonds player Stuart Wardley, former England Under 20 international and Manchester United trainee Kalam Mooniaruck.

In addition to the adult teams, Swifts also currently run ten youth teams from Under 7 to Under 14, competing in the Royston Crow and Brentwood leagues.

Newspaper coverage of the first Junior Cup Final in 1895 shows how much some things have changed in football over the last 130 years, while others remain the same...

HERTS JUNIOR CUP FINAL - St. Albans Reserves v Croxley - The Reserves Win by a Point

The re-played tie in the final of the Herts Junior Cup competition took place on Saturday, on the West Herts ground. The turf, although rain had been falling frequently throughout the week, was in a fair condition, but during the second half there was a tremendous shower of rain and hail, and this made the surface very greasy during the last half hour.

As will be remembered, these teams met on the St. Mary's ground some few weeks since, when the Saints succeeded in vanguishing their opponents by nine goals to two. At the commencement of the game a protest was lodged with the referee by the Albanians on account of the state of the ground.

A meeting of the Association was called, and Saturday's match was the result of their decision. The Saint's team, with the exception of Sygrove, who did duty between the sticks in place of Rickards, was the same that opposed the Croxleyites on the previous occasion, but the paper makers substituted H. Galley and T. Belch for weaker men, and thus strengthened their team.

There was not a very large attendance of spectators. The Croxleyites were rather late, and therefore it was a quarter to four before the teams turned out in the following order:
