# Competition History



## This is the 50th Final of the Hertfordshire FA Sunday Intermediate Cup

The Hertfordshire FA Sunday Intermediate Cup began back in the 1971-72 season, reflecting the rapid growth of Sunday football. The Association had started a Sunday Senior and Sunday Junior competition some eight years previously, but with more and more Sunday teams playing, a third competition was needed to accommodate them.

The Intermediate Cup draws entries from the teams from in the middle divisions of their respective leagues. It is rare to have a team win the Intermediate Cup more than once, due to the fact that they tend to be promoted and then have to enter the Sunday Senior Cup. Indeed only Shakers and Kcinsatop have achieved that feat, both winning twice.

Unsurprising then that both of today's finalists will be looking to record their first win in the competition and become the 48th club to lift the Sunday Intermediate Cup.

*Today's match will be 45 minutes each way, with kicks from the penalty mark to decide the winner if necessary. Teams are permitted rolling substitutions from a list of 5 named players*

The COVID pandemic caused the 2019-20 season to be cut short, with that season's competition being declared void. The Sunday Intermediate Cup was not run in the subsequent two seasons before returning in 2021-22.

## Tackling Mental Health Issues

Football has an important role to play in helping people be more open about their mental well-being

*Tackling the stigma, prejudice and discrimination that can be associated with mental health conditions both in sport and wider society can help save lives*

The FA, along with other bodies in both football and sport, has signed the Mental Health Charter for Sport and Recreation, which is a framework setting out how sport can use its collective power to tackle mental ill-health, emphasising the benefits of an active lifestyle.

One in four people experience a mental health problem in any year, which means there are millions of people involved in grassroots football experiencing a form of it in some way.

It is important football clubs at all levels appreciate this and know how to include people with mental health issues. The FA, along with its partners across the game, is encouraging players, coaches and officials to be confident and comfortable talking about mental health in the same way that people discuss physical injuries.

Football is a great tool in aiding recovery, helps to manage symptoms and can radically improve the quality of people's lives. Whether it is in mainstream, community football clubs, or in specialised sport and mental health projects, football can deliver massive benefits. There are three key ways that football can help:

- Improving people's mental health
- Creating social inclusion
- Helping physical health

To emphasise this, The FA has produced a 36-page mental health guide for coaches and managers in the adult game that can be downloaded below. It's been produced in partnership with Mind, and a mental health advisory group put together by The FA.

The guide has been created to help coaches and managers spot the signs of mental health problems predominantly amongst male players, give them the confidence to support and signpost to specialist help where necessary, including a 24/7 text support service.
