Competition History



This is the 50th Final of the Hertfordshire FA U14 Boys Challenge Cup

The Under 14 Boys Challenge Cup was first introduced in 1971-72 reflecting the ongoing growth of the youth game at the time. Prior to this there had been the Under 18 Cup which had begun in 1930-31 and an Under 16 Cup since 1944-45.

The inaugural winners were Holywell Boys with what would be their only success in this competition. This set something of a pattern for the future, with so few clubs able to win it more than once that there have been no less than 39 different winners down the years.

It is St Albans City Youth who have been most successful in bucking this trend, getting their name on the trophy four times between 1982 and 2006. Both clubs appearing today have reached the final of this competition in recent years, but having missed out on those occasions will be looking to add their name to the trophy for the first time.

Today's match will be 35 minutes each way, with kicks from the penalty mark if necessary to decide the winner. Teams are permitted rolling substitutions from a list of 7 named players.

Recent Finals

The COVID pandemic caused the 2019-20 season to be cut short, with winning semi-finalists Bishops Stortford and Cheshunt declared to have shared the competition. The U14 Boys Cup was not run in the subsequent season.

Giving young people in the local community the chance to play and enjoy sports

Founded as Sun Engraving in 1898, the club then went under the name Sun Sports from 1901 and played in the Watford & District League and West Herts League. The club joined Herts County League Division Two in 1947-48 and were promoted to the Division One in 1955–56. A season later they were in the Premier Division as a result of a league restructure, relegated a year later, but returned again the following season. They then spent their time in the Premier Division until they were relegated in 1980.

In 1995 the club changed its name to Sun Postal Sports when they amalgamated with local football team Watford Postal Services. After finishing runners-up for two seasons in a row, the club joined the Spartan South Midlands League Division One in the 2003-04 season. The 2013-14 season saw the club finish as champions and gain promotion to the Premier Division. At the same time they reverted back to the Sun Sports name.

The club has also become a hub for young people in the community, hosting a variety of teams catering to all ages, along with other sports. The football youth section consistently breeds success within the local leagues, with winning teams upholding the club values that emphasise football as a means of play and enjoyment. The future for our club has never looked more promising as we continue to attract players, coaches and volunteers that will keep striving towards higher standards.

Your analysis of the season so far...

Last season, we made the decision to move this squad from Northwood to Sun Sports and our journey has been marked with incredible progress, despite issues with injuries. We have also welcomed new starters who have massively developed and improved our team.

Our season kicked off well, despite the awful weather and we've really enjoyed it. Currently we have only played nine league games to date so are a little on the back foot and playing catch up. We are however incredibly proud to say that we have achieved great success in that we are in all three Cup Finals in the West Herts League.

The boys have gone from strength to strength, showing their dedication, team spirit and hard work in their training sessions and games. The management are proud of what we have achieved so far and hope to end the season with some silverware, which would be a great way to end our first season with Sun Sports.


