Competition History



This is the 14th Final of the Hertfordshire FA Under 15 Girls Cup

Hertfordshire FA introduced female youth competitions in the 1997-98 season, reflecting the growth in girls playing across the county. This was the first time there had been County Cups specifically for girls in Hertfordshire and included Under 12, Under 14 and Under 16 competitions. Cups for the 'odd' age groups would follow from 2005-06.

With the advent of a fully professional Women's Super League and the impact of the Lionesses winning the Euros, female football continues to reach new heights and the future of the game looks stronger than ever. This continued growth has also led the addition of an Under 18 Girls County Cup in Hertfordshire for the first time in 2022-23.

Harvesters have been the most successful club in the U15 Cup, with three wins including the first two finals. After them come Garston Ladies, who secured back to back wins in 2017 and 2018. Hitchin Belles have previously lifted this cup in 2015 and were runners up last season, while Royston's best run in this competition saw them reach the final in 2022.

Today's match will be 40 minutes each way, with kicks from the penalty mark if necessary. Teams are permitted roll-on/roll-off substitutes.

Recent Finals

The COVID pandemic caused the 2019-20 season to be cut short, with that season's competition being declared void. The Under 15 Girls Cup was not run in the subsequent season before returning in 2021-22.

The club was originally formed in 1975 and fully amalgamated with Royston Town in 2008, with the club attaining the coveted FA Community Club status in 2009. The Royston Town Youth section of the club is run as a sub-committee of the Adult RTFC board with representation from both sections seen in both executive leaderships.

Today, Royston Town Youth is a Three Star England Football Accredited Club which provides football for almost 800 young players, across nineteen boys and nine girls teams. The Club also runs additional programmes including Wildcats for young girls, inclusive football sessions for children with disabilities and Mini Crows Fun Football for 3-6 year olds.

Royston Town Youth prides itself on being an inclusive club, enabling players of all abilities to thrive in a fun football environment. Your analysis of the season so far...

This year marks the third season for the girls playing 11v11 football, having spent the previous two seasons playing as an Under 14 team. The decision to play up a year paid off, with the girls winning both their Division and the League Shield that first year, and finishing close to the top of Division 1 last season.

The 2023-24 season saw the arrival of two new squad members bringing extra strength and depth to the team. We set our objectives high, determined to show the team performance level we know we can achieve and bring home some silverware this year.

The team have had a strong season so far bringing back some resounding and important wins and are currently in contention for the League title. Dropping the odd point occasionally, the team respond with resilience and team spirit.

Safeguarding is about creating safe environments and preventing children from experiencing harm or abuse. Put simply, safeguarding refers to measures we take to protect our children - and keep them safe and well. Whether that's your kids, the opposing players or even the referee, every young person has the right to enjoy football.

The FA offer a short Safeguarding for Parents Course designed to help you to make an informed choice about the football setting you enrol your child in. It starts by explaining the importance of safeguarding in football and the child-centred approach the game takes.

It will then guide you through questions you should ask to ensure the club or venue where your children play has the correct safeguarding policies, people and practices in place. The course also highlights signs that should concern you – and how to report these concerns.

Reporting Safeguarding Concerns

Don't wait for someone else to do something about it

A child or young person may inform you directly that they are concerned about someone's behaviour towards them. Or you may become aware, through your own observations or through a third party, of possible abuse occurring. Either way you need to report it.
