Competition History

This is the 88th Final of the Hertfordshire FA Under 18 Boys Challenge Cup



The Under 18 Challenge Cup was originally administered by the Hertfordshire Minor FA, which was a separate organisation before later becoming the Hertfordshire County Youth FA and then merging with Hertfordshire FA in 1998.

Having first been played in 1931, today's match will be the 88th final of this competition, with several years lost during the war when the competition was suspended, another in 1983 when the final was not played and then two further years due to the pandemic.

While six different clubs have recorded back-to-back wins in this competition down the years, few have ever established any significant periods of dominance. The exception being Letchworth Boys Club, who won four of the first eight finals played.

If Cheshunt win today they would not only join that exclusive group of back-to-back winners, but also to match Carlton as the most successful club in this competition, with five wins in total. Harpenden Colts will be seeking to add their name to the trophy for the first time and if successful they will become the sixtieth different club to do so.

Today's match will be 45 minutes each way, with kicks from the penalty mark to decide the winner if necessary. Teams are permitted rolling substitutions from a list of 7 named players

The COVID pandemic caused the 2019-20 season to be cut short, with that season's competition being declared void. The Under 18 Boys Cup was not run in the subsequent season before returning in 2021-22.

Club Profile Cheshunt Youth



Providing a pathway from youth football into the adult game

Cheshunt FC were founded in 1946, consisting of a first team at senior level and a reserve team. They also ran a very successful juniors Under 18 and minors at Under 16. However, during the 1950s these teams disappeared for reasons that are since lost to time.

In July 1966 Cheshunt Youth where founded, a completely different entity to the main Cheshunt Football Club, playing in yellow shirts and royal blue shorts and socks. This youth club went from strength to strength and added age groups along the way, with teams winning various leagues and cups across the seasons.

In the early 1970s Cheshunt FC invited Cheshunt Youth FC to be amalgamated with the senior club and in doing so Cheshunt FC became one of the largest clubs in Non-League football. In the years that have followed the club have been extremely successful at all age groups, winning Leagues, Cups and County Cups.

The club now runs teams from Under 6 to Under 18. During this time the club has produced a number of players that have gone onto play professional football, Ian Dowie, Paul Marquis, Rueben Agboola, Tommy Fletcher and Jack Midson to name a few.

Safeguarding is about creating safe environments and preventing children from experiencing harm or abuse. Put simply, safeguarding refers to measures we take to protect our children - and keep them safe and well. Whether that's your kids, the opposing players or even the referee, every young person has the right to enjoy football.

The FA offer a short Safeguarding for Parents Course designed to help you to make an informed choice about the football setting you enrol your child in. It starts by explaining the importance of safeguarding in football and the child-centred approach the game takes.

It will then guide you through questions you should ask to ensure the club or venue where your children play has the correct safeguarding policies, people and practices in place. The course also highlights signs that should concern you – and how to report these concerns.

Don't wait for someone else to do something about it

A child or young person may inform you directly that they are concerned about someone's behaviour towards them. Or you may become aware, through your own observations or through a third party, of possible abuse occurring. Either way you need to report it.
