Chatham Town Sundays formally Swallow Rise 93', were formed in 1993 as an U8/U9's team. Manager Ray Knapp took charge of the team back then and is still at the forefront of it all today.

He has taken the club from youth football into men's and has been there all the way as the team has won leagues and promotions from the Combination Division in the Medway Messenger Sunday League right through to the Senior Section in which we have finished this season the closest we ever have, just 3 points behind our rivals Quested.
