### Apprenticeship Programme - Opportunities for Businesses

Lancashire FA is a 'Main Provider' on the Register of Apprenticeship Training Providers (RoATP) and we have six exciting Apprenticeship Training Standards to upskill current or new members of staff.

Local Authorities or private providers delivering sport, sports clubs, Leisure/Fitness facilities, Nursery/Primary or Secondary Schools, or Children's Centres or Play Groups can access these six standards.

These options can also be underpinned by accessing additional qualifications, such as 'Multi-Skills' (Level 2), Level 2 Qualification in Community Sports Leadership, 1 Day Emergency First Aid at Work and Mental Health Awareness courses.

## Safeguarding Update

Sadly, we are currently having to suspend coaches in youth football because a DBS has expired, and no action has been taken to renew in time. This creates difficulties for their clubs and is a great frustration to them too. Please help us to avoid this by ensuring your Club Welfare Officers are renewing coach DBS certificates three months before expiry. In addition, can you please make it clear to coaches and managers that failing to engage with the CWO, or delaying unnecessarily, will undoubtedly lead to suspension.

Following our survey of Welfare Officers earlier in the season, we are about to feed back on the results along with some proposals to try and address the concerns raised and suggestions made. Watch this space!

Meanwhile, earlier this week our Head of Safeguarding, Neil Yates, delivered an Adults in Junior Football Safeguarding Session for parents at Clitheroe Wolves.
