

MATCH RECAP - U16 GIRLS YOUTH CUP FINAL

FLEETWOOD TOWN JUNIORS UIG LIONESSE

BURY FC FOUNDATION U16 TIGERS

Fleetwood Town Junior U16 Lionesses were crowned the U16 Girls Youth Cup champions after defeating Bury FC Foundation U16 Tigers 2-1.

In a game full of frenzy and emotion, an exceptional performance from Honey Harrison won the game for Fleetwood, as she bagged a goal and an assist in the final. It was a wonderful display of attacking skill, producing great amounts of quality in a game of huge importance.

Both finalists were extremely well matched in the early stages, producing a high tempo, end to end game. The importance of the fixture was clear to see, as neither side managed to settle especially quickly and assert dominance over the game.











Despite this, as the game unfolded, chances came thick and fast. Bury's Hannah Murray was unable to convert a good chance from the edge of the box, before Brook Mulhollen saw a long-range free kick rattle the crossbar.

On the 32 minute-mark, however, the deadlock was broken. A high press from Fleetwood forced a mistake from a Bury defender, allowing Harrison to run through and become one on one with the goalkeeper, where she calmly slotted the ball into the net.

The finish was fantastic, and it inspired Fleetwood to finish the half very strongly. Their attack was relentless, putting the Bury defence under great pressure. It was to no avail, however, as Bury remained firm and kept it at 1-0 to half time.

A moment of brilliance from Murray saw the lead disappear. Picking the ball up on the left-hand side, she dribbled impressively through the Fleetwood half before sliding the ball under the keeper and into the net.

In an impressive show of resilience, however, Fleetwood defied the setback and answered back very quickly. A quick and direct run from Harrison saw her in the Bury penalty area; she passed the ball across the box to Emerald Parker who easily found the bottom corner.

The lead was always under threat as Bury never allowed their heads to drop.

The final 10 minutes were not too dissimilar to a basketball game, but

Fleetwood managed to hold on. The travelling Fleetwood crowd, the staff

and the players erupted with joy upon hearing the final whistle.

Bolton Wanderers Girls FC U15 became U15 Girls Youth Cup Final after an impressive 2-0 win over Euxton Girls U15 West.

Bolton's Millie Leytham proved to be the difference maker on the day, as her incredible centre midfield performance saw her record a goal and an assist. In a very pressurised environment, Leytham's composure and creativity proved critical in ensuring her Bolton side walked away with the trophy in their hands.

The first half was extremely competitive, with both teams desperate to make a fast start and take the game away from their opponents. But despite some good chances for either side, this was not the case, as the two sides were struggling to find the finishing touch. Scarlett Prendergast and Natalie Ainsworth, of Euxton and Bolton respectively, found themselves one on one, but were denied by impressive goalkeeping efforts.







It was Bolton who looked more likely to score in the first half, as the width and direct running from Hannah Baldwin was creating problems for the Euxton defence. Through high levels of concentration and perseverance, however, they ensured their clean sheet remained intact until the end of the first half, ending 0-0.

It didn't take Bolton long into the second half to make the most of their momentum as they took the lead early on. After creating several chances which could not quite be finished, Leytham produced a moment of sheer quality to open the scoring. She released a shot from just outside the box which was placed perfectly in the top corner. Imogen Gill, the Euxton keeper, was excellent all game, but even she was powerless against such a well hit effort.

That goal began a spell of dominance which lasted until the final whistle.

They were creating a plethora of chances: Jessica Jepson had a shot cleared off the line and Leytham missed a penalty.

The miss was soon made up for, however, as Leytham played a through to ball to Ivy Caraher who placed the ball into the bottom corner. It was a goal which came close to the end of the game, and the impressive strike sealed a fantastic cup win Bolton.

In the most emphatic win of the day, Bolton shone on the big stage, as their precise build play and relentless pressing proved too much for Wigan to handle. It was a complete performance from the side, and they were very deserving of their title.

An impressive crowd attended the final game of the day, with both Bolton and Wigan being very well backed. Another Bolton age group had just been victorious in a final beforehand so their numbers were large, while Wigan made up for the difference in numbers by ensuring they could be well heard throughout the match.











Bolton came out of the blocks flying, asserting their dominance early in the clash. They seemed to play with more confidence than their opponents, and this was emphasised when Bolton's Emily Chadwick scored the first goal of the game - it was an impressive long shot from the edge of the area, placed out of the goalkeepers reach.

It very quickly got more difficult for Wigan, however, as a one goal lead became two. In a very similar fashion to the first, Eden Slater produced a fantastic finish from the edge of the box, making it impossible for the opposition keeper to reach.

Despite the occasional Wigan counterattack to put Bolton on the back foot, the dominance continued throughout the second half, rewarded by a third goal to confirm the victory. Elise Lucas made a surging run down the right-hand side before crossing the ball across the box, where Leah Johnson was able to convert the chance.

Wigan Athletic had a fantastic run to the final and gave a valiant performance in the final, however, it was Bolton Wanderers who were deserving winners.
