1	Welcome	
1.1	James Middlehurst (JM), Chair of the London FA, opened the meeting and welcomed the new London FA Council to their first meeting of the 2024-2027 term. He reflected on the recruitment process for the Council Members and thanked them all for putting themselves forwards for such an important role.	
	JM explained the purpose of the meeting, which was to elect four (4) London FA Board Directors to represent the London FA Council on the Board.	
2.	To receive and approve the minutes of the Council meeting held on 9 <sup>th</sup> October 2023	
2.1	Received and approved.	
3	An introduction to the London FA – Paul Bickerton, London FA CEO	
3.1	JM introduced Paul Bickerton, London FA CEO, to take the new Council through an introduction to the organisation and explained that PB would then lead the process by which the four Board Directors are elected.	

3.2 PB ran through a series of slides that explained the background to the Council review Slides to be in early 2023, the purpose of the new Council, the activities they would be involved circulated with the in throughout 2024 (for example Committees / Working Groups) and then the minutes of the process by which the four Board Directors are elected from Council. meeting. 3.3 Two queries from Council members followed the presentation, as follows: 3.3.1 The facilities challenge in London and how important the new hybrid pitch recently laid at Regents Park will be. 3.3.2 Whether the disability participation numbers were currently of any concern. PB replied that those numbers generally increased throughout the season and London FA was confident of hitting its targets in that area. 4 **Elections to appoint Council-Elected Board Directors** PB led the process for electing four directors from Council to the London FA Board. 4.1 He introduced Victor Chamberlain (VC) from the Electoral Reform Society, who would count the votes, and Sir Simon Hughes (SH), a former London FA Board Director who designed the process. The following key points were made clear to Council Members: Only appointed Council members, i.e., those recruited and appointed through 4.1.1 the open recruitment process, are eligible to stand as candidates and vote for directors. Council members are asked to elect the directors that they believe will best 4.1.2 represent the London FA Council on the Board. Voting will take place via a secret ballot and a preferential voting system. An 4.1.3 independent representative from the Electoral Reform Society (VC) will count the votes and observe the process. These four elected directors will be the first confirmed new board members for 4.3.4 the new term. All elected and appointed board members (except the Chair who is part way through his term of office) will take office from 1st January 2024 and serve until 31st December 2027. 8 Council members seeking election had been confirmed as candidates and their 4.3 manifestos had been circulated to Council members prior to the meeting. PB proceeded to allow each candidate up to three minutes to address Council, and they were then asked to respond to one question, selected at random from audience members. Once all candidates had presented themselves, Council Members were provided with 4.4 their unique ballot forms and submitted them to the CEO. This was a secret ballot using a preferential voting system. It was announced that the results would be declared before the end of the meeting. **Council Buddying Scheme** 5 5.1 Anita Poulman (AP) presented on the newly introduced Council buddying scheme and Slides to be how this has been working in practice. circulated with the minutes of the 5.2 The feedback on this scheme was overwhelmingly positive, with many of the buddies meeting. having already met up prior to this Council meeting and reporting that it had helped them settle into their new roles. One reflection was made regarding existing Council

Members having been given more notice of their involvement in this scheme, which

was acknowledged.
