### SAFEGUARDING

Middlesex FA are committed to providing a safe and enjoyable football experience for all, as well as ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all staff and participants.

#### Please remember our code of conduct:

- Act in an appropriate way at all times when in contact with children and young people (CYP), and adults at risk (AAR).
- Recognise the importance of confidentiality when working with our participants and their data.
- Promptly report any concerns.
- Act with integrity at all times.

## **HOW TO RESPOND**

**RECOGNISE:** Signs or change in behaviour

**RESPOND:** Empathetic and listen

**REPORT:** Seek advice and reduce risk

RECORD: Report accurate account of events

to safeguarding team

**REFER:** Partner Agencies

#### REPORTING

**URGENT:** If you believe a CYP or AAR is at immediate risk of harm, you should contact the Police as soon as possible on 999.

#### **ALL OTHER CONCERNS:**

Report to the Safeguarding Team through the MFA Reporting Form.

Always try and speak to the Designated Safeguarding Officer at the earliest opportunity for support and advice.
