

HAYES & YEADING UNITED

SIMON GRANT

Former United youth goalkeeper who returned to the club from Bracknell Town in January to finally make his first team debut more than ten years after leaving the Under 18s. Spent the majority of his career, approximately 10 years, with Marlow. Started the season as the regular number 1 at Bracknell before leaving to join United after Michael Eggatt returned to the Robins.

JACK SMITH

Experienced 'keeper who joined United in the summer of 2017 from Dunstable Town having impressed against United during pre-season. Currently holds the club clean sheets record with 33 in 108 appearances. Jack's time at United has been interrupted by injury on many occasions and he has currently just returned from more than 12 months on the sidelines and is looking to regain his place between the sticks.

CHARLIE WASSMER

Club Captain and central defender who returned to United for a third spell in January 2022. Originally a product of the United youth system, having made his way into the first team he played in the Conference National at age 19 before being snapped up by Crawley Town. Has been a force in the United defence since his return and has just completed a loan at Gosport Borough on his return from injury.

JERRY WILTSHIRE

Central defender and current British Virgin Islands international who joined United in the summer from Walton Casuals. Came through the youth system at QPR before moving across the pond to study in the US, firstly at Bethel University and then the University of West Florida. Returning to the UK in 2020, he signed for Maidenhead United before joining Walton Casuals in November 2021.

LUKE WARNER-ELEY

Left-back who joined in February 2023 from Concord Rangers. Luke joined St Albans in 2019 having previously had spells with amongst others Dartford, Harrow and Chesham. After leaving the Saints in April 2021 he signed on briefly with Billericay before moving to Peterborough Sports in September 2021, he remained there until the end of August 2022 whereby he joined Bedford before spells with Cheshunt and Concord.

JOSH LELAN

Experienced defender who joined in January 2023 from National League South side Hemel Hempstead. Having played in the Football League for Swindon and Northampton, he signed for Crawley in January 2017 making over 50 appearances before switching to Aldershot Town. He skippered Walton Casuals to victory at the SKYex against United last season. Josh has international honours with Kenya, making his debut in August 2016 against Uganda.

PAUL FIELD

21 year-old versatile defender who joined United late in August 2022 having ended the previous campaign with Southern Premier Central side Stratford Town. Started out at Stevenage and while there had a short loan spell with Aylesbury FC. Has fitted in really well at United this season and has proved his versatility by playing in every position across the Hayes & Yeading backline this season.

COLE BROWN

Right sided player who came through the youth ranks at United, making his debut in the Charity Cup aged 16. Became a regular first team member thereafter before moving to Uxbridge in 2017. Subsequently played for Hendon and Walton Casuals before settling at Hampton & Richmond in 2019. Returned in January 2022 and has been a key player for United this season due to his pace and versatility.

SANMI ODELUSI

Experienced midfielder who joined in February 2020 from Romford. Has experience in the Football League with Bolton, Wigan, MK Dons, Coventry, Rochdale and Blackpool before moving on to play for Colchester and Cheltenham. In the summer of 2019 he joined FC Halifax Town and then South Shields. After retiring at the end of December 2019 to concentrate on coaching, he returned to playing with Romford prior to coming to United.

AMOS NASHA

Combative midfielder who joined in October 2020 and soon after hit his first goal in the FA Cup against Carlisle. Played a single Europa League game for West Ham against FC Lusitanos before moving into non-league with Dover. Proved to be an integral part of United's push to the playoffs last season with his non-stop energy and commitment endearing him to the United faithful.

JEAN-BAPTISTE FISCHER

Midfielder who joined in January 2023 from Oxford City. He came through the youth ranks with French giants PSG, joining them at the age of 8 and spending many years at the club as their junior team's captain before leaving after eleven years to undertake a degree at Georgetown University in the US. Signed for Wycombe on his return to the UK before signing for National South Oxford City at the start of the season.

TAYLOR MILES

Hard working midfielder who joined in September from Cheshunt and immediately became popular with the fans for his drive and determination. Another to have started at West Ham before moving around to play for Lincoln City, Concord and Chelmsford before signing for St Albans in the summer of 2019 but his season was cut short by injury. Signed for Cheshunt in 2020 and proved a driving force in their promotion season.

REECE COLE

Talented former Brentford midfielder who arrived at United from Chertsey in October 2022 and got United to this final with the only goal against Brentford B in the semi. Made his Brentford first team debut in March 2017 as a late substitute against Nottingham Forest and has also played professionally north of the border with both Dunfermline and Partick Thistle.

JAMIE HANLON

19 year-old midfielder who is currently the youngest ever to play for United in January 2020 aged 16 years and 21 days. Scored his first United goal against Swindon Supermarine on the opening day of last season before missing more than a year through injury. After lots of hard work and dedication, Jamie saw a welcome return to action in December and looks to have a fantastic future in the game ahead of him.

DANNY GREEN

Experienced quality midfielder who joined in December 2022 from Hornchurch. After showing well at non-league level, in the summer of 2010 he signed for Dagenham & Redbridge making his professional debut against Bournemouth in August in the Football League Cup. Moving back into non-league, his most notable spell was with neighbours Wealdstone where he made over 230 appearances, scoring over 40 times.



ROGER JAMES

Speedy winger who joined in February 2023 from fellow Southern Premier South side North Leigh. Described by his former club as "A dangerous winger who can turn on a sixpence and his electric pace and determination make him almost unbeatable 1-on-1" and he was their top scorer when they gained promotion in the 2021/22 season. Amidst three spells with North Leigh he has also spent time with both Kidlington and Cirencester Town.

HASSAN JALLOH

Skilful attacking midfielder who in his fourth spell having returned from Herne Bay in September 2022. Originally signed for United in the summer of 2018 before moving on to play at a higher level with Havant. Returned again last season and relit his scoring touch, netting 15 times in 26 starts over an injury hit campaign. Returned again looking to provide that missing creative spark in the middle of the park.

MOSES EMMANUEL

Prolific scorer who joined in the summer of 2021 from Wealdstone. Netted an amazing 41 goals last season and has continued his form this term having scored 27 at the time of writing. Played professionally for Brentford and in recent years helped Wealdstone to the National League South title. In his time at United he has scored four goals in a game on three occasions, totalling 67 goals from just 89 appearances.

THOUGHTS FROM THE DUGOUT

I'm writing at the end of a very demanding season for many different reasons. As the schedule sits, we have 4 games this week with a trip to Tiverton in 24 hours. I have a huge respect for all the non-league managers, players and volunteers but this schedule has puzzled me and I cannot see how it's been agreed. Despite major concerns, we're here however preceding results will influence how we approach this final. It's a huge achievement for both teams to make the final given the competition in Middlesex. I'd also like to say a thank you to our away support they've been magnificent, and it hasn't gone unnoticed by players and management. The boys have dug really deep to keep us in touch with the play offs and to reach a final, I think we can all be very proud of them this season. It's been a big effort. Congratulations to Steve Baker and Harrow Borough also, may the best team win.

Goalkeeper. Joined Boro' in July on a season long loan from West Ham United where he is very highly thought of. Has represented England at Under 17 level. 34 First Team appearances for Harrow.

SAMUEL ADENOLA

Right-sided defender who joined Harrow in July 2021 from Holmesdale FC. Previously with Erith & Belvedere and Thamesmead Town. A delivery rider who was an everpresent in the FA Cup run last season. 80 appearances for Harrow, scoring 4 goals.

AHMET BILER

Left-sided defender who joined the club in the summer of 2021 from Harlow Town having previously played for Southend United. A courier. 73 First Team appearances for Borough

JADEN SHARMAN

Defender. Joined Boro' in the summer from Potters Bar Town. 32 Appearances for Harrow.

SONNY HART

Defender. Joined Boro' in February on Work Experience from Swindon Town. Made his 1st Team debut v Beaconsfield on 4th February. 4 First Team appearances for Boro'.

KAI OMOKO BROSNAN

Midfielder. Joined Boro' in September from Southern League Central side Hadley FC. Previously with North Greenford United and Hanwell Town. 30 First Team appearances for Harrow, scoring 9 goals.

ISIAH NOEL-WILLIAMS

Midfielder. Joined Boro' in the summer from Chalfont St Peter. 27 First Team appearances for Harrow, scoring 1 goal.

ANOINTED CHUKWU

Striker. Joined Boro' in January from Grays Athletic.
Previously with Crystal Palace (U18s), Salford City (U18s),

Ramsbottom, Widnes, East Thurrock, Romford and Cheshunt. 71 First Team appearances, scoring 1 goal.

JOHNNY ALLOTEY

Wide Striker. Joined Boro' in November from Hitchin Town, where he had originally been a member of their academy. 13 First Team appearances for Boro' scoring 2 goals.

BILLY LEONARD

Midfielder. Joined Boro' in the summer having impressed for North Greenford United last season. 44 First Team appearances for Harrow, scoring 14 goals.

BEN DE LACY-TURNER

Striker. Joined Boro' in March on a Youth Loan from his parent club, Aldershot Town. Has also played on loan at Beaconsfield, Wingate & Finchley and Kings Langley.

HAMILTON BUNGA

Defender. Joined Boro' in March from Northern Premier League side Yaxley FC. This much travelled player has also played this season for Stratford Town.

MONTEL BROWN

Striker. Joined Boro' in the summer having previously played for Woodford Town. *37 Apps for Harrow, scoring 8 apals.*

SAHID NALLO

Midfielder. Joined Boro' on Work Experience from Leyton Orient

JAMES EWINGTON

Striker. Re-joined Boro' in March from Egham Town. Has played for a string of clubs, more recently Kings Langley, Ware and Tilbury. 90 First Team appearances for Boro' scoring 52 goals.

ROMAN CHARLES-COOK

Defender. Joined Boro' on a Youth Loan from Sutton United. Has also played for South Park and Cray Wanderers.

ACTION REPLAY

RAYNERS LANE WIN THE MIDDLESEX PREMIER GUP

JIM TAYLOR

The Middlesex FA Premier Cup final was contested on the evening of Wednesday, 5th April, at Bedfont Sports FC, between Rayners Lane and British Airways. Both of these clubs currently play at non-league step 6, in Division One of the Combined Counties League. Rayners Lane FC were formed in 1933 while British Airways started as the BOAC Speedbird Club in 1947.

The Middlesex Premier Cup was first competed for in the 1980-81 season, when it was won by Yeading FC, who were then members of the Middlesex League.

18 teams entered the competition for the current season. Rayners Lane and British Airways both received a bye in round 1.

British Airways reached the final by beating the holders, FC Deportivo Galicia 3-2 (at home) in round 2, Brook House 4-0 (away) in the quarter-final and Uxbridge U23 team (away) in a penalty shoot-out, following a 1-1 draw.

Rayners Lane had played all of their matches at home and had beaten Rising Ballers Kensington 3-0, Hillingdon Borough 4-1 and Enfield Borough 3-0.

Rayners Lane took the initiative early on and were 2-0 ahead by the 17th minute of the game. There was no further scoring and the game became scrappy during the second half

Jake Tabor hit the ball into the side netting of the British Airways goal in the first minute. Rayners Lane kept up the pressure and Robert Magwood headed over the bar from a corner.

Rayners Lane took the lead in the 14th minute. Ollie Lawford made a run up the wing and squared the ball to Jake Tabor. Who shot on the turn into the corner of the net.



Jake scored his and Rayners Lane's second goal just 3 minutes later. He went on a run, cut in and fired the ball into the roof of the net

BA keeper, Ben Clargo, punched away Jake's in-swinging corner.



Then Jake connected with Ollie Lawford's ball into the box but Ben saved from close range.

British Airways got into the match. Rayners Lane goalkeeper, Charlie Patmore left his penalty area to head away from striker, Edward Clements.

Charlie then saved a bullet header from BA defender, McCauley Wheatley, who had advanced up-field for a corner.

James Barnett had two scoring attempts for BA. He fired wide and then his law shot was saved

Rayners Lane's Ian Vangu was fouled in a wide position just outside the BA box. Ben Clargo knocked down the resulting well struck free kick from Jake Tabor.



Jake Tabor was prominent in a series of Rayners Lane attacks. He released Sidney Gueye through the middle and the latter forced a corner, despite overhitting his final touch. Ben Clargo took a long ball of off Jake's head. Then Jake's run through the middle was halted by a timely tackle by Louis Spearing.

As the second half progressed, the standard of football deteriorated and the match became increasingly scrappy, with play being frequently stopped for various reasons. Referee Conor Griffin had to administer several warnings and eventually cautioned 6 players, 3 from each side.

British Airways made the first of their permitted substitutions in the 63rd minute and the fifth and final one in the 77th minute. Rayners Lane then followed with four substitutions, starting in the 83rd minute. In the 65th minute, Ben Clargo brought down Sidney Gueye, just outside his penalty area and received a yellow card. Jake Tabor hit the freekick over the crossbar.

A long-range swirling freekick by BA's Harry Tubb was kept out, with some difficulty, by Charlie Patmore.

A good move by BA, their best of the game, involving several players, ended with Tyler Hayles shooting wide.

Sidney Gueye then headed a cross from Ade Adewale against a BA goalpost.

A good advantage played by the referee allowed Rayners Lane substitute, Archie Oates to ride a foul and progress into the penalty area, where his final touch let him down.
