## Norfolk County FA Continuing Misconduct

## What is it?

A Continuing Misconduct case will automatically generate in the event that a player or team official accumulates a certain number of cautions or standard charges.

Cautions - Players

| No of Cautions | Cut Off Date (inclusive) | Automatic Suspension |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| 5 | $31^{\text {st }}$ December | 1 match suspension $\& £ 15$ fine |
| 10 | $2^{\text {nd }}$ Sunday in April | 2 match suspension $\& £ 15$ fine |
| 15 | End of Season | 3 match suspension $\& £ 15$ fine |
| $20+$ |  | Every 5 cautions will result in a CMC thereafter |

- Sin Bins contribute towards the caution totals
- $£ 10$ administration fee applies in addition to the fine unless the contributing caution was a sin bin
- The suspension applies to the category of football that the cautions were incurred in, i.e. Saturday, Sunday, Friendly
- Cautions in FA Competitions (FA Cup, Vase, Trophy) do not count toward the totals above
- 2 yellow cards in the same competition = suspension from next match in that competition
- Caution count applies up to and including the $1 / 4$ Final stage


## Standard Charges - Players

Players who are dismissed on more than one occasion in the same category of football will receive an automatic 1 match suspension in addition to the standard sanction.

A third dismissal in the same category will incur an additional 2 match suspension, and so on.

## Cautions - Technical Area Occupants

Technical area occupants can now receive yellow and red cards for incidents of poor behaviour.
Automatic sanctions are imposed should an individual accumulate a certain number of cautions during a season:

- 4 cautions $=1$ match ground ban
- 8 cautions $=2$ match ground ban
- 12 cautions $=3$ match ground ban
- 16 cautions = misconduct charge

There is no cut off point for each threshold as there is for player continuing misconduct.
Cautions for technical area occupants are not competition specific.
