FA PROVIDES UPDATE ON TIERS 3-6 OF THE WOMEN'S PYRAMID

The 2020/21 Season for tiers 3-6 of the Women's Football Pyramid will be curtailed with immediate effect and declared incomplete, with no further league fixtures taking place this season. There will also be no automatic promotion and relegation between these tiers for the 2020/21 season, including no promotion from tier 3 into tier 2 and no relegation from tier 6 into tier 7.







The Categories are as follows: Coach of the Year for adults, Project of the Year, Coach of the Year for youth, Rising Star of the Year, Club of the Year, Match official of the Year, League of the Year, Grounds Team of the Year, Teams can apply for promotion to certain tiers if they meet specific criteria, or voluntary relegation. There are an estimated 6% of players within mainstream leagues that are eligible for an England Disability Team. Who knows there may be a future England International currently playing in your team that currently doesn't know about the opportunity to represent their country.

CSN GETS THE GREEN LIGHT FOR **CHARTER STANDARD**

One of Norfolk's most prominent adult leagues, the Central & South Norfolk League, has been given the green light by the FA in their bid to become an FA Charter Standard League.

The FA Charter Standard League status is an accreditation that sets an operational benchmark for FA sanctioned leagues. It is awarded to leagues which can demonstrate their commitment to provide well organised football in safer, more inclusive environments.



Central & South Norfolk League Secretary, John Turner said: "The Central & South Norfolk League is delighted to have been accredited as a Charter Standard League by the FA.

"It has long been an ambition of the Management Committee to achieve this award and, with fantastic backing from our clubs (over 90% in favour of making an application), and tremendous support and encouragement from Norfolk FA, we now intend to build on this achievement to make the league and our clubs ever stronger by embracing the opportunities that accreditation brings."
