Having recently completed the latest developments of its flagship football hub with support from the Football Foundation totalling £971,040, Norfolk FA is planning for Phase 2 of the project which will see a £646,040 Football Foundation grant being utilised towards a much larger development at the premises. Norfolk FA is looking to work with our Accredited Clubs and Leagues to create bespoke support that will raise the standards of the football environment, upskill the voluntary workforce and enable Leagues to deliver a wide range of provisions.

The <u>Norfolk FA Noticeboard</u> is where you can post content related to #NorfolkFootball such as advertising for players, coaches or volunteers.

You are now able to post opportunities or advertisements on the noticeboard without the need to contact Norfolk FA directly. Posts can include hyperlinks such as email addresses and websites, not to mention graphics and photos.

Noticeboard posts require approval from Norfolk FA and will be regularly monitored by Norfolk FA staff. Your post should appear on the Noticeboard within 3-5 working days and we reserve the right to remove unsuitable or inappropriate posts. Accredited Clubs and Leagues can "build your own" support workshop that will be delivered by Norfolk FA staff, National FA staff and external professionals to as little or as many volunteers/parents/players within the club or league as necessary. The Football Development Department will work with Clubs and Leagues to build the content on one or more topics to be delivered at a time that suits them.

The term '**Position of trust**' refers to a situation where one person holds a position of authority over another and uses that position to their advantage.

Clubs should be vigilant and, on the look-out, particularly within female and disability football to ensure coaches, officers and volunteers are not potentially abusing a position of trust that they hold, for self-gain.
