Norfolk is currently experiencing a serious challenge regarding referee coverage across the County's grassroots football scene, a problem which is causing great concern to Norfolk County Football Association and its sanctioned leagues.



To try and address the issue and ensure matches are being covered across the County, Norfolk FA are calling on people to take up the whistle louder than ever before. Having already delivered two FA Referee courses this season, the Governing Body has organised four more courses to take place over the next two months, all over the County.
