
WELCOME

THE 2023 COUNTY CUP FINALS

Norfolk County FA recently released the dates of their annual County Cup Finals including those to be played at the home of Norwich City.

The big news is that the Norfolk Junior Cup Final will be returning to Carrow Road, after last being played at the venue in the 2018/19 season when Gorleston Reserves beat Sprowston Athletic 2-1. Both the <u>Ashtons Legal</u> Senior Cup Final and <u>Harrod Sport</u> Women's Cup Final will also be played at Carrow Road on Thursday 18 May and Friday 19 May respectively.



The other eight County Cup Finals will be hosted at Harrod Sport Arena at The FDC, Bowthorpe and will see the return of the popular 'double headers' with the John Savage Cup Final and Stuart Dracup Cup Final both taking place on Sunday 23 April, as well as the 4Work Primary Cup Final and Norfolk Intermediate Cup Final both taking place on Saturday 13 May.

SAFEGUARDING REQUIREMENTS IN GRASSROOTS FOOTBALL

With the 2023/24 season quickly approaching, there are a number of new Safeguarding requirements which will have an impact on Club Affiliation. It is extremely important that Clubs begin to action these requirements now so that all elements are in place ready for the affiliation window opening.



For 2023/24 Club Affiliations ALL Clubs with Open Age/Adult teams are required to have a named Club Welfare Officer at the point of affiliation. Affiliations will not be approved if they are submitted without this role being filled by a named official. These officials as of now, do not require any additional safeguarding qualifications or DBS check.

Norwich City Women will host Ashford Town at Carrow Road next month in their final home game of the FA Women's National League season.



The game has seen over 5,000 tickets sold already in what is being tipped as a huge occasion for Women's and Girls' Football in Norfolk. It will be the first time that Norwich City's Official female counterparts have played at the ground since full incorporation with the club in February 2022.
