PARTICIPATION, INCLUSION & INVESTMENT: '#NORFOLKFOOTBALL FORALL'

We are pleased to announce our new strategy, '#NorfolkFootball ForALL' which will run from 2018-21.



The three year strategy aims to inspire a lifelong journey in football for all as well as increase football participation in Norfolk by 25%.

Created in 2015's 'Engaging the Next Generation', our 'DNA' core values will continue to run through the heart of the new strategy and a renewed focus on Safeguarding and Inclusion will aim to ensure that Norfolk is a forward thinking County, setting standards for others.

Some of the key strategic objectives of '#NorfolkFootball ForAll' include: a 5000+ increase in player participation; embracing all formats of football such as Walking Football and Disability Football; delivering £5m worth of facility projects; and increasing, retaining, and rewarding the volunteer workforce.

Norfolk FA Chief Executive Officer, Gavin Lemmon lead on the creation of the new strategy along with his Senior Management Team: "We developed '#NorfolkFootball ForAll' with The FA's 'For All' strategy in mind. We want to ensure that anybody in Norfolk who wants to play or be involved in the grassroots game is not only able to, but has a clear and defined pathway to do so.

"We're proud of what we do at Norfolk FA but we're always striving to improve. This strategy will challenge us in new and exciting ways, and as a collective we can't wait to tackle the next three years head-on."

Chairman of the Association, Michael Banham said: "After weeks of hard work from Gavin and his team, I and the Board of Directors were delighted to approve the new strategy for the next three years. I'm pleased at the way in which the plans outline efforts to confront nationwide challenges such as participation, as well as embedding important issues such as Safeguarding and Inclusion. We received overwhelmingly positive feedback when presenting this strategy to The FA in June, which supports my opinion of us being one of the most forward thinking Counties in the Country.

"I look forward to this next period of progress within Norfolk Football and I am sure that Gavin will oversee his first strategy as CEO with great success."

Carrow Road will play host to this European Championship Qualifier on Thursday 6 September (7.45pm KO).

The Young Lions sit top of Group 4, five points ahead of their Dutch visitors with four matches to play.



Head coach Aidy Boothroyd, who spent three years at Norwich City working with youth teams, said: "It is a brilliant club in an amazing part of the country, with great supporters. We hope they'll come out in big numbers to get behind the team as we look to get all three points and work our way towards qualification.

"This match is a really important one in our aim to qualify for next summer's Euros. Netherlands are a really strong side and it will be a tough and entertaining game."

The Annual Football Futures Camp took place from 9am-5pm on Thursday 2 & Friday 3 August 2018 at The FDC, Bowthorpe.





LATEST GRASSROOTS SURVEY SEES RECORD RESPONSES

The Football Association has today announced the recordbreaking results of its latest Grassroots Football Survey.

The survey, which provides grassroots football participants with an opportunity to voice their opinions on the football provision in their county, received 30,315 responses – up from 28,750 and 30,161 in 2015/16 and 2016/17 respectively – from over 6,000 adult players, 1,000 youth players, 6,000 coaches, 3,000 referees, over 3,000 club and league officials, as well as parents, spectators and wider volunteers.

Kelly Simmons, Director of Participation and Development, said: "The third Grassroots Football Survey will continue to shape the national picture of football in England and allow County FAs to put the thoughts and opinions of those in their area at the heart of decision making. I am delighted we have seen more engagement from participants than ever before and look forward to seeing the impact of increasingly tailored investments and services."

Headline statistics and general feedback from the latest Grassroots Football Survey include:

- Artificial grass pitches and pitch improvements are key areas for facilities investment
- However, 35% of participants now find it easy to access an artificial grass pitch
- 91% believe any form of disrespect does not belong in the game
- All groups, except adult male players, predict participation levels will increase next season
- 73% of participants desire greater interaction with their respective County FA



TEMPORARY DISMISSIALS (SIN BINS) TO BE USED IN ALL NORFOLK FA'S ADULT LEAGUES FOR 2018/19

The Football Association has announced that select trials of Temporary Dismissals – more commonly known as 'sin bins' – will continue during the 2018/19 season before becoming mandatory for all leagues at Step 7 and below from the 2019/20 season. Click here to find out more.



31 leagues from across the country at Step 7 and below of the National League System and Tier 5 and below of the Women's Pyramid of Football took part and resulted in the following:

- 25 leagues showed an overall reduction in dissent
- 38% reduction in dissent across all leagues
- 72% of players wanted to continue with the scheme
- 77% of managers and/or coaches wanted to continue with the scheme
- 84% of referees wanted to continue with the scheme

Norfolk County FA are providing training over a WebEx which will provide a presentation on Sin Bins as well as providing updates on any other disciplinary matters. The presentation will last around an hour and it is open to all members of #NorfolkFootball.
