Following on from the recently held EGM where revised Articles of Association were unanimously approved, the opportunity to join the Board at Norfolk County Football Association is now available, with six appointed Director Positions within the revised leadership structure.

The positions will start in July and will be for a 3 year term through to June 2022 with the existing Board of Directors continuing in post until the AGM & Council Meeting taking place on 1 July 2019.

The Director role requires a commitment to monthly Board meetings which predominantly take place at 6.30pm on Monday evenings at the County Headquarters along with being part of Norfolk County FA's Council.

Norfolk reach this year's FA County Youth Cup Final by beating Cheshire after going a goal behind.



Cheshire started the game as expected at a very fast pace, creating a number of good opportunities in the opening minutes, with one these being taken when a well delivered cross from the right was bundled into the Norfolk goal after the danger had failed to be cleared.

Norfolk headed into the break knowing that they needed to up their game if they were to give themselves any chance of getting into the final.

Norfolk's dominance showed in the second half as they were rewarded with three goals meaning that they ran out 3-1 winners.

Norfolk will now face Manchester in the Final of The FA County Youth Cup on Saturday 13 April at Spotland, the home of Rochdale FC.

FUNDING AVAILABLE FOR FEMALE AND DISABILITY TEAMS IN NORFOLK

Grow the Game, which is delivered by the Football Foundation and funded by The FA, was first launched in 2010 to provide clubs with funding for the creation of new teams and chances for aspiring footballers in the local community to play. Since launching, the scheme has helped to create over 11,000 new teams, delivering new playing opportunities to an estimated 144,000 community footballers.

Grow the Game grants of £1,500 will be made available to every new team created, helping to relieve the financial burden on clubs by helping towards FA coaching courses, league affiliation costs, referees' fees, first aid kits or even kit and equipment. In 2018, the scheme helped to support the growth of 872 female and 294 disability teams respectively.

NORFOLK FA GRASSROOTS DISABILITY STARTER PACK

The Disability Starter Pack is aimed at providing support to clubs who would like to establish a provision of disability football. These grants can be used towards things such as specialist equipment for disability football.

The provision of football established as a result of the starter pack, is primarily aimed at supporting a turn up and play style taster session. The idea being that the pack provides an opportunity for clubs to instigate initial interest from disability players with the potential to develop this into a disability team in the future.


Also Phil will cover the general maintenance of pitches during the off-season to ensure that they will be in the best condition possible come the start of the following season.

- Understanding mentoring assessment, feedback, and goal setting processes
- Considering the importance of reflection as a tool for learning
- Exploring CPD and reflective Action Planning opportunities for Mentors to consider their future development
