- To qualify: Referee 5 Matches = FA Certificate








FAQs

Are there any Additional Costs:

If you are 16 years old or older and wish to referee youth football, you must have a valid and in date DBS. Getting a DBS with Norfolk FA costs £10.00 which is valid for three years.

Referee kit

At the beginning of each season you must also re-register and this costs £20.

Are there any age limits re: the course?

Anyone aged 14 or over can become a referee. There is no upper age limit but candidates need to be able to fully participate in practical sessions. Until you reach the age of 16, you will only be able to referee games involving children at least 1 year younger than yourself.



Are there any pre-requisites for the new referee course?

Yes, you must have completed and passed the Guide to Online Laws of The Game and completed your safeguarding. These course links can be found on the booking page.

Where will I referee my first 5 games?

We will send all referees a preference form to find out what types of matches you want to officiate and what days are your preference. We can either appoint you to matches or we can help you find a local club to referee for. The appointments are flexible around your availability and you can close dates that you are unavailable for.

How do I progress as a referee?

Norfolk County FA is keen to support and help referees develop and progress to achieve their full potential and as such, have a structured progression pathway for referees. The full criteria can be found on the Referee Promotion page of the website under Development.
