# **REFSUITE**



Administration is an important part of being a match official and whilst we do not expect you to be available 24/7, we do expect you to tell us when you're not. Our 'calendar' system, which is also used by many other league within the County, is called RefSuite.

Please ensure you download the mobile app, available via the app store.

# REFEREE REGISTRATION

At the start of every season (June 1st onwards) you must re-register as a referee. This currently costs £20 and covers your CPD offer. You can also purchase optional extras, including an NFA referee badge.

To register for each season you must be compliant to referee; please see below the information required to be compliant.

# **DBS & SAFEGUARDING**

You must have an in-date safeguarding qualification, regardless of the age group that you referee. This must be renewed at regular intervals and can be done by completing the free, online safeguarding for all course detailed on page 4.

If you are aged 16+ and you referee youth football, you also need a DBS. The DBS process is explained here.



# **NEW REFEREES**

#### MAKE CONTACT WITH LEAGUES FOR MATCH APPOINTMENTS

Once you have decided which league is most suitable for you, it is up to you to contact the league appointment officer. If you are unsure which is best, please do not he sitate to contact us for advice.

There are a few key points to consider when making contact with an appointment officer:

- 1. You need to register with whichever league(s) you intend to referee on. You can do this by contacting the relevant appointment officer.
- 2. Consider your plans on a weekly basis and how these will impact refereeing. Specifically, consider whether you wish to referee open age/youth football and the day(s) that you are available.
- 3. Consider the format of football that you wish to referee i.e. mini-soccer, 9v9 or 11v11.
- 4. You can register with more than one league, but please be clear with your administration/closed dates. This will prevent a 'double booking' or clash of appointments.
- 5. Appointment officers deal with lots of referees on a weekly basis, so please be clear with your open/closed dates and make sure you're on the ball!
- 6. Reliability is crucial. Don't let yourself down.





# LAWS, REGULATIONS AND REPORT WRITING/ DISCIPLINE PROCESS

#### **LAWS OF THE GAME**

Every referee should have a good knowledge of the Laws of the Game. The International Football Association Board (IFAB) have created a handy phone application.

As you may know, sin-bins have been implemented at all levels of grassroots football. As a referee you must have knowledge of sin-bins and how/when to use this valuable tool.

# REPORTING DISCIPLINE AND MISCONDUCT

#### WHOLE GAME SYSTEM

Whilst you do not need to submit a report for every game you referee, you MUST submit a report within two working days of a fixture being played if you issue any yellow/red card(s) and/or need to submit an extraordinary report.

Reports should be submitted via the WholeGame System

# REPORT WRITING

#### **REPORT**

It is important as an official that when you have been involved in an incident, observed something or been informed of an incident within the game you need to report this to Northants FA through the Whole game system.

#### **EXACT**

Be very specific on the events of the incident. It is valuable to include the exact actions you witnessed and what was reported to you along with the words used — use exact quotes in "speech marks" of the words you have heard or the words reported to you. If this includes offensive/expletive language, please be clear by reporting the exact wording; do not block letters out with special characters. Identify exact individuals: name(s), their role at the fixture (i.e. manager, spectator etc), a physical description (i.e. age, height, build, hair/skin colour), Shirt number (if applicable). The more information, the better.

### **POSITION**

Where were standing in relation to the incident? Where on the field of play? Within the clubhouse? Or any surrounding areas? Did you have a clear and unobstructed view?

#### **OBSERVATION**


What time did the incident happen within the game, including the minute and how long the incident lasted? You should include if this happens, pre, post or at half-time as well. What was the cause of the incident and how did it conclude?

### **RELEVANCE**

Only include information that is relevant to the incident – be clear and concise.

### **TIME**

A Match Official must submit their report within 48 (working) hours of the match, to ensure that appropriate action can be taken in a timely manner by Northants FA.





# REFEREE DISCIPLINE SUPPORT

When a serious incident is reported the County FA follows the following process:

- 1. Assault on a match official (including spitting or attempting to spit)
- 2. Physical contact on a match official (water throw)
- 3. Aggravated (ethnic origin, colour, race, nationality, faith, gender, sexual orientation, disability) [between players or directly at referee]
- 4. Threatening behaviour towards the match official (personal space, use of language or intimidation)

#### STAGE 1 - REFEREE REPORTS INCIDENT

Referees should be reporting incidents within 24 hours of full-time via the Whole Game System. If there is an error or you cannot submit the report, please email discipline@northantsfa.com

#### **STAGE 2 - COUNTY FA CONTACTS REFEREE**

Within 48 hours of the Whole Game System Report, the Referee Development Officer (RDO) or County FA representative will contact the referee for further support if the incident is one of those outlined above.

#### **STAGE 3 - COUNTY FA STAFF MEETING**

Once a week, the Referee, Discipline and Safeguarding departments meet to triage all incidents outlined above and any involving U18 referees to discuss if follow-up action is required.

#### STAGE 4 - COUNTY FA DISCIPLINE TEAM INVESTIGATE

The County FA Discipline team will conduct the investigation. If a charge is raised and the defendant requests a personal hearing, the referee may be required to attend as a County witness. If this is the case, the County FA will provide support to the referee, usually through the RDO & DSL.

#### STAGE 5 – DURING AND POST CHARGE DECISION

Support is available for the referee during a personal hearing upon request; if the referee is under 18, they will receive Personal Hearing Guide for U18s. All outcomes to be communicated by the discipline team to the referee.





# REFEREE PROGRESSION PATHWAY

Thinking about making the next step in your refereeing career? Northamptonshire FA are committed to develop all referees whether this be to a county level referee or a World Cup final referee. The County FA are responsible for promotion from Level Y1-Y2, Level 7-6, Level 6-5 and Level 5-4 in the Male Pathway and Level 4W-3W in the Female Pathway.

The Referee Progression Pathway (RPP) offers opportunities for referees to progress to the next level throughout the season. If you wish to be considered for promotion, please ensure you have reviewed the RPP criteria for each level and contact us.

The graphics below demonstrate the football that you will referee at each level of the English pyramid.

# REFEREE SUPPORT / DEVELOPMENT

### **REGULAR CPD EVENTS**

We hold regular CPD events across the County to cater for our refereeing population. Topics range from fitness sessions to VAR and we are proud to host high-quality quest speakers, including Football League and Premier League match officials! # **NFA COUNTY CENTRE OF REFEREEING EXCELLENCE (CORE)**

NFA County CORE is a development group, run specifically to provide supercharged development opportunities and coaching support to selected officials throughout the season. The County CORE group feeds into the National CORE group, on which officials are supported into the professional levels of the game. Places for our County CORE group are highly competitive and we run an assessment day at the start of every season, whereby referees are put through a number of tasks to ascertain their suitability for the group.

# REFEREE SUPPORT / DEVELOPMENT

### REFEREEING WORKFORCE

One of the most important and rewarding roles within football is to support referees. In Northamptonshire, we have 3 'tiers' of support. If you are interested in supporting the next generation of referee, please contact us!

#### **MENTORING**

Mentors support our generally newer and less experienced referees. As a mentor, you would be appointed by the league to go to watch and support a referee, providing them with feedback at half-time and full-time. This should be as positive as possible and is designed so that the referee grows in confidence after hearing your feedback. Mentors are currently paid £20 per visit.

#### MATCHDAY COACHING

Matchday Coaches support the development/progression of Level Y1, Level 7 and Level 6 referees who have applied to join the Referee Progression Pathway (RPP) and who are attempting to progress to the next level. Referees receive at least two coaching reports during the course of the season and a coaching visit is generally expected to be supportive, designed to help the referee in the early stages of their development. Matchday Coaches are currently paid £30 per visit.

#### **OBSERVING**

Observers support the development of Level 5 and Level 4W referees who have applied via the RPP to progress to the next level. Referees receive at least four observation reports during the season and an observation is generally expected to be a much more formalised process, focused around preparing the referee for Supply League or Women's National League football. Observers are currently paid £40 per visit.





# **U18 REFEREE SUPPORT**

U18 Referee Support is a vital part of the support we provide as a County FA and is shaped by the U18 Referees across Northamptonshire. Each year we would like to know how best to support you, so please don't hesitate to contact us to provide your feedback!

#### **U18 YELLOW ARMBAND**

Last year we received feedback that over 66% of U18 Referees would like a yellow U18 armband. We acted on this recommendation and have implemented this across the County. If you are an U18 Referee and do not have a yellow armband, please get in touch.

#### **CALLBACK EVENINGS**

As seen above, we also hold Callback Evenings to provide support to those referees that have recently completed the FA Referee Course.

#### **MENTORING**

Our mentoring scheme is now in place across the two youth leagues in the County. Primarily, mentors are sent to support newer and less experienced referees, however they may be used to go and support any referee, of any age, level or experience. If you have not yet been visited by a mentor and feel you would benefit from some advice & guidance, please let us know!





# **CHANGING ROOMS**

#### WHERE CAN I GET READY FOR THE GAME?

If you require changing facilities at your game, you may have to share a changing room. If the other officials are over 18, do not share the changing room whilst you are getting changed. Please ask the over 18 referee the leave the changing room whilst you change and vice versa.

# **INCLUSION**

#### WHAT IF I FEEL EXCLUDED FROM OFFICIATING MATCHES?

If you have a disability or impairment or believe there are restrictions in place preventing you from fully accessing and enjoying referee then please inform us. Football is inclusive and that applies to refereeing too.

# **SOCIAL MEDIA**

#### WHAT IF I AM CONTACTED ON SOCIAL MEDIA?

Do not invite adults in a 'position of trust' (referee/ mentor/ observer/ coach) to become friends on social media.

Be mindful of 'liking' comments - these can be viewed as seriously as if you had written them yourself.

Do not post, text or email inappropriate language, pictures, jokes or items of a personal nature that are derogatory, sexist, racist, threatening, abusive or sexualised. If you receive any of these, report this to Northamptonshire County FA Safeguarding Team.





**SOCIAL MEDIA** 

Social media is a large part of 21st-century life, and this has changed the world of refereeing; the below guidance is in place to offer best practices on using social media.

Good news, positive stories and support from colleagues is encouraged; we can all play a part in raising the profile of refereeing.

Once something has been said or posted, be prepared to be accountable for it.

If you have liked a post, this is regarded as you are endorsing the post.

Avoid commenting negatively on clubs, players, or incidents you have been involved in.

Fellow referees and observers, at any level, are considered as colleagues. Remember this when commenting on football. Again, avoid negativity .

You are more than welcome to post positively and raise the profile of refereeing by sharing posts from PGMOL, The FA, Northants FA or other positive story sources.

# PLAYERS TOUCHING A PATKA OR TURBAN

Match officials need to be aware that to a Sikh, touching their head covering (Patka or Turban) without their permission is an offensive act (as it is a religious article of faith) and should this occur and seen by the match official it should be considered a red card offence. Patkas are often tied at the back and, if this is pulled or touched in an improper manner, regardless of any potential reaction, it is an offence classified as S6 using offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or action(s), and the offender must be dismissed.

Please be sensitive to the specific nature of this type of incident and deal with it appropriately. In addition to any disciplinary action taken, an Extraordinary Incident Report should be submitted.

Should a referee require clarification as to whether a headscarf worn by a player is a religious article of faith, we would advise the match official to speak to the individual prior to the match.
