# SENIOR CUP

The Senior Cup was first contested in the 1884-85 season with Culham College FC emerging victorious as inaugural winners. Oxford City hold the record for the most Senior Cup victories lifting the trophy on 32 separate occasions.

This season saw 26 teams enter the County FA's premier cup competition with a total of 98 goals scored in the run up to tonight's final.

# OXFORD CITY

Est. 1884



Oxford City Football Club was formed in 1884, serving as a 'representative club' comprised of players from multiple teams within the city including, but not limited to Oxford Cygnets, Oxford United College Servants, and Oxford Wanderers. The club initially played friendlies against other local sides, but gradually expanded to take on more prestigious sides from further afield. Winning the Oxfordshire County Cup (now the Senior Cup) in 1900 was the first real success, as well as appearing at the 1st Round stage of both major FA competitions in 1901/02. The FA Cup run took them to the final 32, equivalent to today's 4th Round, and saw the club take 2nd Division Lincoln City to a replay – an achievement which, to this day ranks among the club's greatest moments. Nowadays, the Club provides a high standard of competitive youth football at all age groups from U7's to U19's. The college programme, in association with Activate Learning and Ignite Sport, has seen great success with numerous players coming through and earning caps with the first team. The talent from the programme has seen the club break records in the FA Youth Cup, getting to the Second and Third Round in consecutive seasons in 2015-16 and 2016-17. The club also runs Ladies and Girls sides that have had great success in the Southern Region Women's Football League.

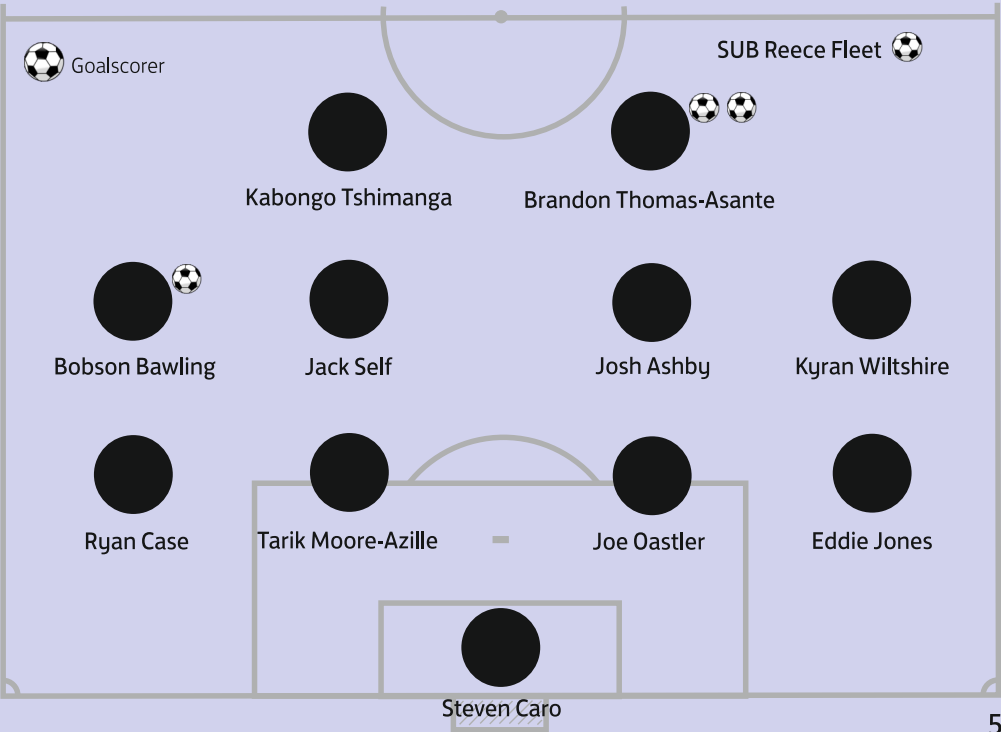

# BANBURY UNITED

Est. 1931

Banbury United's genesis is to be found in Spencer Villa, a works club formed in 1931. The club joined the Banbury Junior League for the 1933-34 season and won the championship at their first attempt. In 1965 the club was renamed Banbury United after a change in ownership, and at the end of the 1965-66 season they transferred to Division One of the Southern League. In 1972-73 they reached the first round of the FA Cup for a third time, this time losing 2-0 at home to Barnet. In 2014-15 Banbury won the Oxfordshire Senior Cup for a sixth time defeating North Leigh 4-3 on penalties in the final. However, they were also relegated to Division One South and West at the end of the season. In August 2015, a supporter-led Community Benefit Society took formal control of the club. Their first season in Division One South and West saw them earn promotion back to the Premier Division through the play-offs.

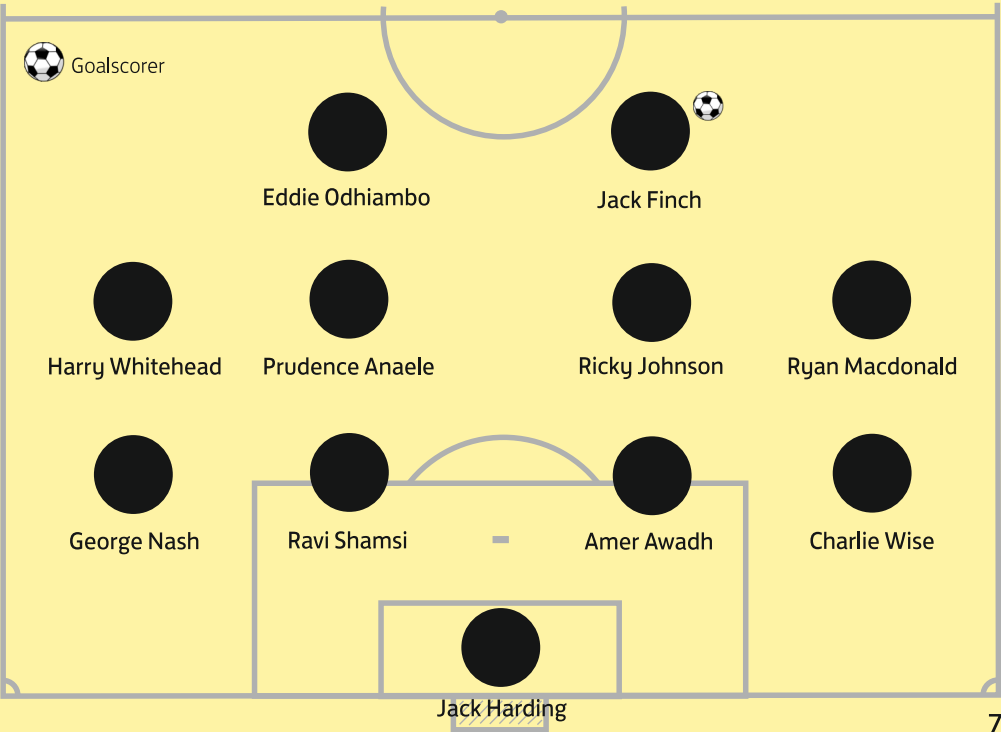

James has refereed for almost nine years and has been fortunate enough to officiate at the Cardiff City stadium for an England Senior Women's International team. He has enjoyed all refereeing experiences in a vast range of competition levels and is looking forward to officiating in this prestigious cup final.
