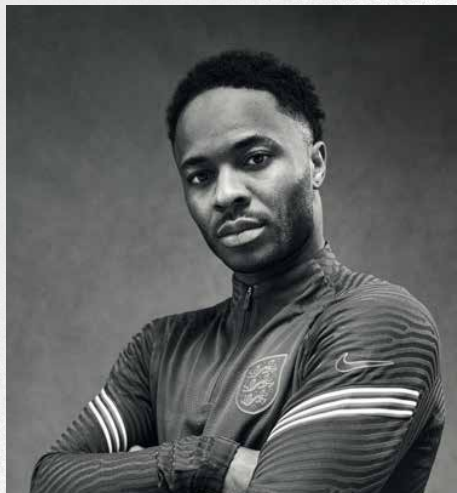

CLUB HISTORY

The original Denaby United, formed in 2002, had its Northern Counties East League status disbanded due to being denied access to their ground by their landlords. The club now play on a ground leased from the local authority. From 2011 the club spent three seasons in the Doncaster Senior League, during which time they twice won a treble – the Premier Division, League Cup and Doncaster FA Challenge Cup – before moving to the County Senior League for five years, winning Division 1 during that time. They moved back to the Doncaster Senior League in 2019, being placed in the Premier Division, and have remained in the top division since.

It is an honour for our club to have reached the final of the County FA Junior Challenge Cup and play on such a prestigious venue as this. Although we have achieved success at league level on a fairly consistent basis, this is our first final at County level after narrowly missing out in 2011 in the semi-finals; our best showing. It is now in the hands of our players to take that final step and achieve County Level success. While we obviously want a winning result, I want all our players to savour the experience as it's an experience they will remember for years to come.

Steve Ellor – Forward

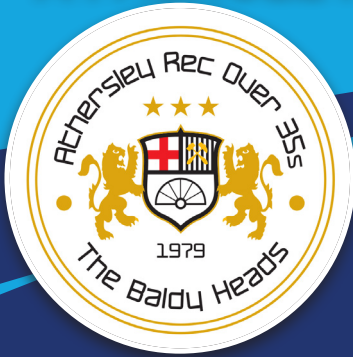
Veteran striker now aged 40, scored goals throughout his career and has scored more than 300 goals for the club in only 260 appearances.

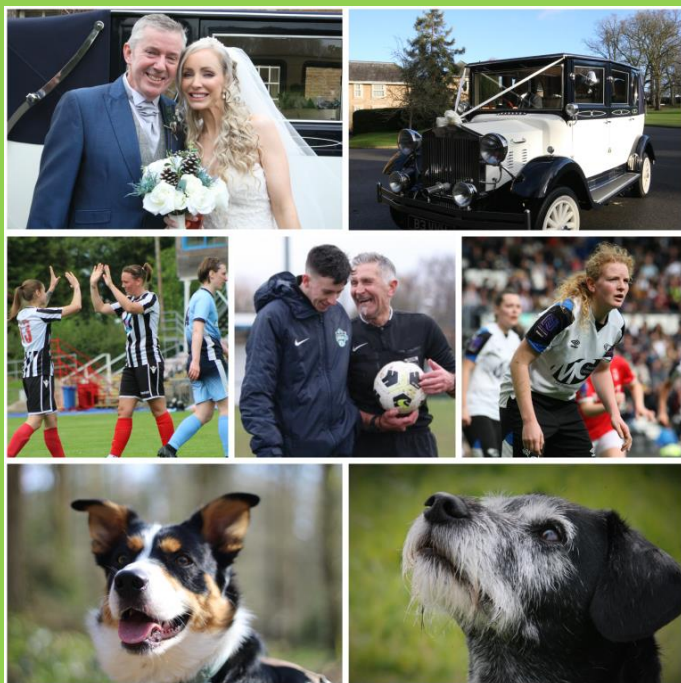
