# **MATCH PREVIEW**

After a two-year absence due to the coronavirus pandemic, the final of the fourth oldest surviving cup competition in the world returns tonight.

The Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup is regarded as one of the most prestigious football competitions in the county, with non-league teams from Step 7 and above from the English football league pyramid competing to win the 145-year-old competition.

Worksop Town are no strangers to the competition, making their 34th appearance in the final since 1900. The Tigers had to overcome a resilient Rossington Main side to win 2-1 in the semi-finals. Ten years on from their last Senior Cup final victory, Worksop Town will be looking to make it their lucky 13<sup>th</sup> final win; just one behind the competition's most successful clubs, Frickley Athletic and Sheffield Wednesday (both with 14 wins).

Malty Main are looking forward to their first Senior Cup final appearance in more than 40 years after a 3-2 semi-final victory over local rivals Parkgate at Muglet Lane. The Miners are hoping to emulate the Maltby team of 1978, who beat Mexborough Town Athletic 2-1 at Doncaster Rovers' former Belle Vue ground to record their first and only Senior Cup final victory.

Since its formation in 1876, the Senior Cup finals have been played at various professional and amateur grounds within the Sheffield and Hallamshire region. But this is the first time the final will be held at Doncaster Rovers' Eco-Power Stadium since the £20m facility was opened in 2007.

#### **CLUB HISTORY**

Worksop is the 4<sup>th</sup> oldest club being founded in 1861.

During their long history they have competed in the Sheffield Leagues, Midland League, Northern Premier League, Conference North and the Northern Counties East League.FA Cup success includes reaching the last 64 in 1907/08 (vChelsea), 1921/22 (vSouthend Utd), 1922/23 (vTottenham) & 1955/56 (vSwindon Town). The club reached the quarter-finals of the F A Trophy in 2000/01 & 2005/06.

Worksop have had four home grounds: Netherton Road, Bridge Meadow, Central Avenue and Sandy Lane.

Famous players who started at Worksop include Alan Hodgkinson and Jack Brown, both becoming England goalkeeper.

#### MANAGER CRAIG PARRY

I am proud to lead us into the final; I hope I can help bring silverware home and make those who love the club proud.

Ecclesfield Red Rose were tough to play against, the Handsworth game was like a rollercoaster, and the Rossington Main fixture was difficult.

I have huge respect for Maltby Main and I have done for a while. I think they're a well-run club and every time I have managed against them, they have always conducted themselves in a great way.

We must ensure that it is a game that we play our way and take the game to them, and bring the silverware back to Worksop.

Worksop-born Luke is from the club's Under-21s and has enjoyed several cameo appearances, including in the semi-final win.

#### Jake Picton (Defender)

Club captain who has played for the likes of Scunthorpe United, Harrogate Town, Frickley Athletic & Pontefract Collieries.

#### Adam Watson (Defender)

Centre-half signed from Grantham Town and has played for Leeds United's Academy & Rossington Main. Can also play as a striker.

#### Jack Broadhead (Midfielder)

Is a product of the Chesterfield Academy and has a wealth of playing experience in the higher steps of non-league.

#### Cody Cromack (Midfielder)

Talented ballplayer, who began his career with Liversedge FC before joining Craig Parry at Pontefract Collieries

#### Aleks Starcenko (Midfielder)

Also a promising attacker, who normally operates behind the front two. He has also played for Guisley & Pontefract.

#### Nathan Valentine (Midfielder)

Is a box-to-box midfielder, who joined the club from Ossett United and has a wealth of non-league experience.

#### lyrwah Gooden (Forward)

A direct forward that likes to run at his defender before executing an early drive towards goal – joined from Workington.

#### Liam Hardy (Forward)

Prolific forward who is a menace in front of goal and scored two goals in as many games on our journey to the final.

In his third spell with the club. Was an important player during the club's double-winning season in 2018/19.

#### Aaron Sennett-Neilson (Forward)

Skilful winger who is in his third season with the Tigers and has a bright future ahead of him.

Tenacious forward who can also operate out wide and in a deeper role. Followed theTigers boss from Pontefract Collieries.

#### **CLUB HISTORY**

Maltby Main FC was formed in 1916, affiliated to the local colliery. The original Maltby Main FC was disbanded in 1965.

Maltby Miners Welfare FC was formed in 1970 and played in the Sheffield Senior League until 1972, when they joined the old Yorkshire League and became founder members of the Northern Counties East League in 1982.

The club won the Sheffield Senior Cup in 1977/78 beating Worksop Town 3-2 in the semi-final.

In 1992/3 the club finished 4th in the NCEL Premier Division and won the President's Cup.

The club reverted to Maltby Main FC in 1996. Up the Main!
