Sheffield & Hallamshire County Cup Competitions 2018/19 Important Information

From the 2012/13 season the County FA piloted a new system for administering County Cup Competitions – Full-Time for County Cups

This new system allows the County FA to send out Cup notifications and referee appointments via email. Any updates will also be sent out via email.

Clubs will then be notified of their fixtures for All Cup Competition Rounds using the Full-Time email notification system.

If you do not have an email address you should be notified of your Cup fixture by post.

If you have an email address registered with us, you should have received an email verification from us via Full-Time. When you receive this email, you will need to click on the link within the email to confirm that you are happy to receive emails from us via Full-Time.

One of the key aspects of Full-Time for County Cups is that it provides counties with the facility to have results sent in by SMS Text Message from Clubs.

Many of you may already be familiar with this process if your League also uses Full-Time.

You may have noticed on the Whole Game System that there are 2 roles which appear within your club contacts section for each Separate Team – Full-Time Email Contact & Full-Time SMS Contact. These contacts can be manually amended by clubs using the Whole Game System, you can have more than one contact for Full-Time Email Contacts.

How to...Update SMS Club Contacts

The SMS contact numbers used for the SMS functionality for County Cups are taken direct from the Whole Game System.

The SMS Contact number for each team is believed to automatically set to be that of the Club Secretary (assuming he/she has provided a mobile number) but you may login to the Whole Game System and replace the 'Team Full-Time SMS Contact'.

Please note that only a maximum of 2 SMS users may be used for each separate Team.

How to...Submit SMS Results

Full-Time will automatically text the SMS contact 15 minutes after the scheduled start time of the fixture as a reminder to text in the result at the conclusion of the game.

The format of the outgoing SMS message sent out is as follows:

FA Full-Time Results: CHED v ARSD, Sun 12 Feb 14:15. Reply with H-A score & code CHED, followed by AET & PENS if required: eg 2-2 CHED 3-3 AET 3-1 PENS

The Short Code (CHED & ARSD above) is not normally required, as Full-Time identifies which team a user is associated with according to their mobile number. However, if the user is potentially reporting scores for more than one team (e.g. their 1st XI and reserves are playing game on the same day) then they will have to include the short code in their reply, or Full-Time will be not be able to identify which team's result is being reported.

The Team Administrator is therefore required to potentially send back up to four pieces of information in the same SMS text message:-

- 1. Score The score after normal time in the usual way
- 2. Short Code if they are required to submit a short code, to identify which team is involved.
- 3. Extra Time score the score line after extra time, followed by AET (it is essential that AET is included, to identify that the scores beforehand applies to extra time)
- 4. Penalty score the score after penalties, followed by PEN (it is essential that PEN is included, to identify that the scores beforehand applies to penalties)

If the normal time score is not level, then any extra time and penalty score will be ignored. If extra time is not played, and the game goes direct to penalties, then do not input and extra time scor nor AET (e.g. 2-2 CHED 3-1 PEN means the game finished 2-2 and went straight to penalties). Examples

All of the following examples assume that no team code is required:

2-1	Reports that the home team won 2-1 normal time
2-2 3-2 AET	Reports that the home team won 3-2 after extra time
2-2 4-3 PENS	Reports that the home team won 4-3 after penalties; the game
	having finished 2-2 at the end of normal time, with no extra time played
2-2 3-3 AET 4-3 PENS	Reports that the home team won 4-3 after penalties: the game having finished 2-2 at the end of normal time, and 3-3 at the end of extra time
