CATEGORIES

The Lioness Award

Inspired by the Women's Euros victory and its impact on and off the pitch, this award recognises the people who are using football as a way of inspiring positive change in the women and/or girls' game.

Club of the Year

The Club of the Year are the beating heart of their local community. They demonstrate, both on and off the pitch, that they are inclusive, play their part in the local community and support The FA with initiatives such as Wildcats, Squad or Just Play, increased on pitch opportunities for male, female or disabled players.

Grounds Team of the Year

This award is for the grounds team who excels when it comes to making sure grassroots football happens, and the pitch and facilities are ready to go. They might not have a specific title, but these people are the ones who make sure the whole space – from the pitch to the facilities – are always safe, welcoming and fully prepared for the game.

League of the Year

The League of the Year has dedicated volunteers who clearly demonstrate, both on and off the pitch, how they proudly create a safe, fun and inclusive space for everyone. The judging panel has considered how they demonstrate support of The FA initiatives and its valuable role in the community.

Coach of the Year – Female, male and disability pathway

This award recognises those coaches who are inclusive, encouraging and inspiring when it matters most. In particular, it identifies those who have stood out when engaging players, developing strong positive relations with players and parents, and creating a safe, inclusive and positive space for everyone involved.



Match Official of the Year

This award category is to recognise the match officials who have impressed on match days or in the refereeing community. It's for those who have shown dedication and commitment to supporting the game and match officials, whilst showing empathy and respect to all involved.

Young Volunteer of the Year

This is someone who has made a real contribution to football in the community. A person who is a role model and gives the best of themselves to make the game for all. Someone who provides a valued voice for other young people, or a valuable skillset as part of a wider team.

Grassroots New Volunteer of the Year

This category recognises volunteers who have started in football this season and immediately made a positive impact at their football club, league or other organisation.

Positive Football Environment Award

We're looking for a volunteer who's gone the extra mile to create a positive football culture. One that is warm and welcoming, and fun, safe and inclusive for everyone. It could be someone in your club or league, or a volunteer, player, referee or an organiser of social football.

The Geldart Award

The Geldart Award was donated to the Sheffield & Hallamshire County FA in 2018 by David Geldart in memory of his parents, who did so much to establish and develop youth football in the Worksop area in the 1970s and 80s.

JUDGING PROCESS

The judging panel was made up of a team of four external judges from across the local community who were each assigned their own categories. The judges assessed every nomination anonymously, with great effort made to remove references to names, clubs, leagues, etc. to ensure each nomination was judged fairly, equally, and without bias.

No Sheffield & Hallamshire staff or board/council members were involved in the judging process. All winners and highly commended recipients were chosen by the independent judging panel.

The judging panel made their decisions by scoring each nomination on the positive impact a nominee has made on grassroots football, with guidance notes provided by the County FA. During this stage, judges determine which entries are worthy of winning the category as well as selecting a highly commended award.

Highly Commended awards are given when a nomination has scored highly but just misses out on being the winner of a category

WINNER

GAIL FLETCHER - SILVER STRIKERS

FOOTBALL LEAGUE

With the popularity of women's football flying high in recent years, the demand for girls' football has never been greater. The league has taken advantage of this to reflect the community they serve. After being inspired by the clubs themselves, the league dedicated time and resources to enable the launch of the Doncaster Girls' League. The new league ensures that more children are able to get active, meet new friends and boost their confidence whilst engaging in football within Doncaster.

"Previously, girls who wanted to play football in Doncaster either had to play in mixed teams or travel further afield to play girls' only football. But now, girls between the ages of seven and ten have access to a girls' only league on their doorstep."
