STARTING NEXT SEASON Temporary Dismissals (sin bins) will be used across all grassroots football for Dissent only



## WHAT IS DISSENT?

A player is temporarily I dismissed if guilty of I dissent by word or action I

## It is the responsibility of Clubs to control their players



Dissent is covered under Law 12 and is in the opinion of the Referee



The use of offensive, insulting or abusive language is NOT dissent and is a sending off offence


## There will be no admin fee for clubs for a 'sin bin'

Applies to **players** only and not substitutes or coaching staff

Period in the sin bin is 10 minutes for all matches of 90 minutes. 8 minutes for all other matches

If the sin bin period has not expired at the end of the first half, it continues during the second half (or extra time)

If a temporary dismissed player commits another yellow card or red card offence during the sin bin period they cannot take any further part in the game Referee Signals by using a Yellow Card in the normal way and points to the touchline



Sin bin cautions will be reported to the County FA and used for continual misconduct

All sin bins will be reported by referees but there will be no admin fee charged

The sin bin time starts when the player has left the field of play.
The referee also includes any lost time

The referee has final decision on when a player can return to play

A player in the sin bin cannot be substituted until the period has expired (and not all, if all substitutes have been used)
