Club Accreditation Renewal Guidance





How To Renew Your Club Accreditation

As an England Accredited Club, you will need to maintain the standards and requirements as set out by The FA/England Football.

To monitor this and to replace to previously known Annual Health Check, Accreditation Renewal will be the process to maintain you Accredited Status each season.

This is also the opportunity for you to progress and gain a star if your club is ready for the next step.

This guide will explain everything you need to do to get through your Accreditation Renewal



Club Portal


First, you will need to log in to your <u>Club Portal</u> as this will be the dedicated hub for your Accreditation and for the management of your teams and club officials.

You will then need to go to the 'Dashboard' tab on the left hand side panel.




You can access the <u>Club Portal</u> by logging into the Whole Game System, clicking on you club tab, then scrolling down and clicking the button on the left called 'Club Profile'

Countdown – How many days until the renewal window closes



Welcome to the 'Club' tab of your Accreditation Checklist. Here, everything should either be GREEN 'Complete' or GREY 'Not Applicable'.

Icon Guide

'Contact your linked club' – This means that the current section you are on, meets the requirements, however a linked section does not. See the orange chain icon to find out who needs to take action.


Orange 'i' – If you hover over the 'i', this will explain who needs to take action to meet the requirements

Eg; Who needs an updated DBS.

Orange number in brackets '(6)' – This is the number of outstanding actions for each page


Orange Chain – This means that your linked clubs require action to be taken.

For example, officials from the adult section, girls section etc. If you hover over the linked chains, it will tell you which clubs apply.



- All club officials, coaches etc in Youth Football must have an indate DBS Certificate. We would highly recommend those in adult football obtain a DBS also due to potential 16/17 year old in the team.
- 2. You must have a Club Welfare Officer in place with the correct courses completed.
- All members of the committee must have completed the online Safeguarding for Committee Members Course.
- 4. All individual open age teams must have 1 named official who will be present on match days that has completed the Introduction to First Aid in Football Course.

Welcome to the 'Officials' tab of your Accreditation Checklist. Here, everything should either be GREEN 'Complete' or GREY 'Not Applicable'. There a 5 criteria checks for you to complete.



5. All Youth Teams within your club must have at least 1 fully qualified coach.

This means that one coach must have all of the following;

- Introduction to Coaching Football or The FA Level 1 in Coaching Football
- Introduction to First Aid in Football (in-date)
- Safeguarding Children's Course (in-date)

This is in addition to an in-date DBS which is required as well.

We understand that whilst the First Aid and Safeguarding courses can be accessed instantly, the Introduction to Coaching Football Course will be a date in the future. Therefore, there is the option to make a declaration of commitment to say that as a club, you will work to achieve this criteria as soon as possible. This will then be reviewed at next season's renewal window.


- Club Rules You must adopt The FA
 Club Rules or upload a copy of you own
 club's constitutional rules.
- Clubs with young players or youth teams must adopt The FA Safeguarding Children Policies.
- You must adopt The FA Equality policy at every level of your club.
- 4. You must adopt The FA Respect Codes of Conduct at every level of your club.
- You must adopt The FA Football Leadership & Diversity Code at every level of your club.
- 6. You must have a Club Development Plan. This can be your own version, or based on the template you can find in Club Portal.
- 7. Your club must maintain a set of club accounts. Your County FA may request these during the season.



You must retain copies of your club accounts and then make a declaration to confirm you have copies of last seasons accounts.








How to adopt The FA Policies




- 1. Click 'Adopt' next to the policy you wish to adopt.
- 2. Then a box will pop up in the middle of your screen. Here, you will need to click 'View' to view the document.



3. You will then see the policy pop up on screen. Read through this and once complete, select the grey 'X' in the right corner of the document (not the browser)





- 4. You will then go back to the box you saw previously however, the 'Adopt' button will now be green. Select 'Adopt' and you will complete the Action.
- 5. You can then download the document to print and view whenever you require it






How to upload Club Development Plan & Rules





3. Select which document you wish to upload



4. Then click 'Browse' to upload the document from your computer/laptop. Once uploaded, this action will be complete.



Club Development Plans

You will see on the Documents Page of your Accreditation Checklist that there is a section for your Club Development Plan.

There is a new template which has replaced the previous Charter Standard document. This is a downloadable document from the England Football website. We would ask all clubs NOT to use the previous template as this is not an up-to-date reflection of the new England Accreditation requirements

You can use the templates provided, or you can use the templates as a guide to create your own version.



Player Pathways

Back on the dashboard page, under the 'Player Pathways' header, you will be able to see whether the teams you have in your club and linked clubs currently meet the pathway requirements for the Star Status you currently have. (These requirements can be found on the next pages if you are unsure of what they are)

If you select the 'SHOW' button below, this will expand the screen further to show each of the three different pathways. This is shown on the next page.






Player Pathways

Here you will see the current teams you have which will automatically be ticked based on the teams showing on your Club Portal 'Teams' page. Any teams from linked clubs will show up in here as well.

You will also see on each pathway section what the requirements are for that pathway. From this, you should be able to identify where you may have any gaps. You may also be able to identify that you are ready to move up to 2 Star or 3 Star.







To be a one star Accredited Club, you must:

Offer a minimum of one affiliated male or female or disability team at any age group playing within an FA sanctioned League competition.



OR

1 male team at any age



1 female team at any age



1 disability team at any age





To be a two star Accredited Club, you must:

Offer a complete accredited player pathway for either male or female or disability football, all playing within FA sanctioned League competitions.

In addition, offer a minimum of one team at any age group from an alternative pathway.



Offer at least 1 team in at least 8 of these age groups

To be a three star Accredited Club, you must:

Offer the complete accredited player pathway for both male and female whilst offering a minimum of one disability team at any age group, all playing within FA sanctioned League competitions.





Once every section is showing Green or Grey, across ALL pages on the Accreditation Checklist, you will then be able to complete your renewal.

You will get a box appear on your screen automatically said you are ready to submit your renewal. All you have to do is select 'SUBMIT FOR RENEWAL'
