

Recruitment



- Public A focus on more people from outside of football.
- Unemployment sector Enterprise, Jobcentre etc.
- Adult only referee courses retiring players
- Universities and Higher Education look to deliver sessions within universities to promote benefits of refereeing.
- Continue with the usual promotions alongside additional focus.



- Call Back Events




Mentoring



- Referee Mentor Co-ordinator (Ross Crawford)
- 19 x mentors
- Initially targeting leagues with highest number of trainee referees.
- Funding secured to help fund the mentoring programme – honorarium, safeguarding and DBS renewals and mentor clothing.





Training Events



- Regular training evening's in each part of the county, open to all referees.

- Every 8 – 10 weeks, book on via Eventbrite.

 Staffs County Senior League – observation scheme / training programme.



Respect Marshall's / Armbands




- Aim to arrange Respect Marshall update evenings within youth leagues – launch the referee armbands for u18's referees
- Remind referees of the Respect Marshall's and help educate them on their role in the process.

Training Opportunities



- Create hubs within regional areas to deliver training on a regular basis, open to all.

Lichfield, Stafford and Stoke

 Link in with the Local RA's to support and deliver training to a wider audience



Social Media



- Promotion of senior referees via twitter,
 Facebook and website. E.g. Case Studies, "Day in the Life"
- Promote positive referee news stories –
 Prestigious appointments for Staffs FA officials.
- Look to re-launch the Staffs FA Newsletter for referees.



CORE Groups



- Continue to deliver the referee development groups for all promotion candidates.
- Places also offered to high performing referees, and those showing an interest in promotion.
- Senior CORE supporting Level 4 and above referees.
- Utilise the mentoring scheme to create a pathway for any official to enter the CORE groups.



2020-2021



- Look to expand the Mentoring Scheme to cover all youth leagues
- Create a mentor scheme / support scheme for the new adult referees on open age leagues
- Continue to deliver a comprehensive course programme to increase recruitment
- Female only, Adult only and half term courses





- Work with the Universities and Colleges to create a Referee Hub for officials that qualify whilst in education.
- Aim to establish a partnership between youth and adult leagues to create a pathway and share referees
- Provide further training for Saturday referees to ensure 3 match officials continue to be appointed on every match


