I may be:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- meet with the Required to club committee
- Obligated to undertake an FA education course
- Obligated to leave the match venue by the club
- Requested by the club not to attend future games
- Suspended or have my club membership removed
- Required to leave the club along with any dependents

 The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club

REFEREE: Tom Ling

Tom, who is 23 and from Ipswich, has been refereeing for eight years and is currently a Level 5 match official, officiating on the Suffolk & Ipswich League as well as on the assistant referee panel for the Eastern Counties League. This is Tom's second Suffolk FA final after previously being Assistant Referee on the U18 Midweek Final in 2019.

ASSISTANT REFEREE: Niamh Bailey

Niamh Bailey, who is 19, qualified as a Level 7 on the men's pathway and a Level 4 official on the women's pathway in 2020. She currently officiates in both women's and men's matches as well as grassroots games. Niamh is studying a BSc Honours degree in Sport Performance Analysis at Cardiff Metropolitan University and is particularly interested in football.

ASSISTANT REFEREE: Amy Stockley

Amy Stockley, who is 17-years-old, has been refereeing for three years now. She is a Level 7 referee and mostly officiates as an assistant in the Senior Division of the Suffolk & Ipswich League. Amy, who lives in Felixstowe, was part of the first all-female team to officiate a men's SIL match.

FOURTH OFFICIAL: Stephen Baldock

He is currently a Level 5 Referee and officiates in the Eastern Counties League and Eastern Region Women's Football League Premier Division. REFEREE SUPPORT OFFICER: Chris Dale

Aged 66 and a former Level 4 official, Chris previously refereed the Suffolk Women's Cup Final at Portman Road and officiated on the Eastern Region Women's Football League including the end-of-season play-offs, cup final and plate. He currently mentors newly-qualified officials, and is lead coach at the Suffolk FA Youth Referee Academy, supported by dedicated colleagues, to guide the early development of young officials.

- To campaign for legal and regulatory changes to improve safeguarding in sport

Our objectives are:

- To secure partnerships with clubs at all levels, in all sports
- To engage with survivors and signpost them to the appropriate professional support
- To engage with survivors within the Offside Trust Support Network
- To support charitable helplines with specific focus on survivors in sport
- To change the law on child sexual abuse being exempt from 'Double Jeopardy'
- · To lobby for 'Mandatory Reporting' to be adopted in UK law
- To engage with political and judicial bodies to strengthen legal support for survivors

Since 2016, the Offside Trust has received the support of supporters, clubs, players and former professionals throughout the sporting world. We focus on all sports, not just football. We are grateful for the support that we are getting from everyone including the people in cricket, rugby, golf and boxing, helping to raise further awareness across sport.


The Offside Trust works alongside governing bodies, charities and organisations that deal with safeguarding.
