A Guide For Club Referees

If you are stepping in to referee a game, take a look at this handy guide below outlining your roles and powers as a Club Referee.

PRE-MATCH CHECKLIST

Are all players wearing the appropriate equipment?

Check that all players are wearing suitable footwear and shin pads. No jewellerey should be worn or taped.

Is the Field of Play and equipment safe to play?

Take a walk around the field of play to check for anything that might be dangerous. Pay particular attention to anything loose on the field, as well as ensuring goalposts are safely secured to the ground.

Have you got the correct equipment?

As you assume all the powers and duties of a qualified official, you'll need a whistle, watch(es), and red and yellow cards (just in case!)

Who is going to help you?

In 9v9 or 11v11 football, ask for some support from clubs by providing Assistant Referees to help with the ball in and out of play and offside judgements. Introduce yourself and

discuss how you can work together.

DURING THE MATCH

As a Club Referee, you assume all of the Powers & Duties of an appointed Match Official.

Don't forget that:

Temporary Dismissals (commonly known as Sin Bins) are in operation to manage dissent during games at all Grassroots matches. An online guide to Sin Bins can be found at: www.fareferees.co.uk/temporary-dismissals or by scanning the QR code at the bottom of this page.

Should it be required, you may administer cautions or dismissals (yellow / red cards) as you feel appropriate. The name and offence should be recorded at the time so that you are able to report them to Suffolk FA following the fixture.
