Introduction

The role of the fixture secretary or organising the fixtures for the league is at times one of the most challenges roles. The person(s) performing this role have to take into account a number of different factors such as pitch sharing, pitch availability, midweek travel, County Cup dates and deal with the weather. It is not as simple as listing teams to play against each other a lot more planning and thought goes into this process.

Leagues should map out the fixture programme for the season and communicate this to clubs and teams. If a Youth League, there are certain rules around the competition structure, so please contact your County FA to make sure your fixtures comply with the regulations.

Leagues are encouraged to make sure they have considered County Cup dates and religious festivals in their fixture programme. County Cups take priority over league fixtures.

A top tip is to ask clubs/teams if they have any pitch sharing requirements so that they can be factored into the fixture programme. Using a fixture grid reference can assist with pitch sharing across multiply divisions and competitions.

A number of youth leagues have added Futsal as part of their winter offer in youth leagues.

Fixture Programme Map

Leagues should map out the fixture programme for the season and communicate this to clubs and teams – this could be done relatively early in the process – it does not need to contain the actual fixtures, but indicated the fixture rounds. This is a good exercise to help leagues plan ahead, especially useful if you can map over school holidays and religious festivals etc.

If a youth league you may want to do several versions, one for each age-group so that you can stagger trophy events (U7-U11) and league cups (U12+) out to assist with fixture planning.

Notes:

The maximum division size will be 12 teams, so divisions might have 10 or 11 teams within them. Therefore the maximum number of playing rounds is 22 for a 12 team division.

The first two rounds of both the league and the county cup and league cups are included. If teams have a bye or are knocked out then they are strongly encouraged to bring forward fixtures.

When it is allocated blank on the schedule this is a date where games will be re-arranged too if required.

Pitch Sharing

Pitch-sharing often occurs across different leagues, and or age-groups and divisions with the same league. Therefore, all fixtures need to be compiled together. If they are done in isolation problems will occur. It's always advisable to use a fixture grid as having the same grid will allow for the pairings to be the same for everyone.

Top Tips:

- Collate all pitch requests and then work with the teams/clubs with the most variables.
- The collation of requests should normally take place at the point teams register with the league but always doublecheck if teams are still registering before commencing work on the fixtures.

Fixtures Grid

Use this grid for all your fixtures and it will assist with any pitch-sharing issues. You must use this grid across all divisions for pitch-sharing issues to work, as the grid references are paired up. i.e. when Team A is at home Team L is always away. The paired positions are in the brackets in the above list. E.g. if two clubs share a pitch and they are in two separate divisions, then one should be Team A and the other Team L to avoid any pitch clashes.

Note: when compiling the fixtures, you may need to have to change a team's grid reference several times to make sure all, or as many as possible, pitch-sharing requests can be facilitated.
