



Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior Léague Veterans' Divisions



Introduction

This is a brief introduction to the Veterans Divisions run by the Wiltshire Senior League as we're keen to expand the League, especially in the south of the county.

- We set up a Veterans Division in 2019 after the Wiltshire FA had run a successful Flexi League for several seasons.
- After meeting with clubs who had played in the Flexi League, we set up a Division of 8 teams.
- Fixtures got underway in October only for the season to be brought to a premature end by Covid-19.
- The start of season 2020/21 saw membership more than double to 17 teams, arranged into two Divisions ... one for North Wiltshire and one for Mid/South Wiltshire.

- Again, Covid-19 played its part with two lockdowns but, with great co-operation from the clubs, fixtures were completed in July.
- Corsham Town won the Mid Wilts Division, pipping Melksham Town to the title by 3 points. In the North Wiltshire Division, KMLC emerged champions, 4 points clear of Redhouse.

- For 2021/22, membership has increased again and we now have 20 teams playing in two regionalised Divisions.
- Fixtures are played mid-week, mostly on 3G pitches. The League hires the 3G venues and the home club reimburses the League.
- We currently have the use of four pitches at three venues ... New College in Swindon on a Tuesday night (8:30 to 9:30pm), Green Lane, Devizes on a Monday night (9:00 to 10:00pm), Green Lane, Devizes on a Tuesday night (9:00 to 10:00) and Royal Wootton Bassett Town on a Wednesday night (8:30 to 9:30pm).
- However, if a club has their own pitch (either 3G or grass with floodlights), they are also welcome.



- We currently have four teams (Bradford, Corsham, Devizes and Melksham) who play their fixtures under lights on grass pitches. Teams who have their own pitches normally kick off about 7:30pm.
- We also have a few resourceful teams who have found their own 3G pitches and we have teams playing at Bulford Camp, Lyneham and Selwood Academy in Frome.
- Those of you in the south of the county will perhaps have read that a new 3G facility is about to be constructed at Sarum. This is due for completion around the end of this year. We've already registered our interest in taking a slot or two and are therefore keen to recruit teams from the area with a view to setting up a South Division, which could commence early in 2022.



- For those of you in the north of the county, a new 3G facility is being planned at Moredon in Swindon, which we believe should be available from mid 2022.
- We've found that the success of the Veterans Divisions is mainly due to the clubs and players.
- Games are 25 minutes each way, so not so taxing as a 90 minute game.
- Fixtures are not necessarily every week, so not a massive commitment.
- Many teams and players have also found that, as well as helping with fitness, it's become quite a social event with several meeting up with players they haven't seen for a few years and enjoying a chat over a drink afterwards.

How It Works & What It Costs

- > The League arranges fixtures and appoints Referees.
- We try to arrange a fixture for each team at least once a fortnight.
- As mentioned, matches are 25 minutes each way and are for players over 35 (on 1st September of the current season).
- Our long term aim is to also have a Division for the Over 45's.
- Players who play at Step 7 (our Premier Division) or higher, are not eligible to play in the Vets Divisions.
- Every team is allowed 5 substitutes, which are "rolling" (on and off) as required.



How It Works & What It Costs

- Players are registered on The FA Whole Game System whilst Fixtures, Referee Appointments, results and tables are published on the FA Full-Time website. Training and access will be given to Clubs not familiar with these systems.
 - Annual League fees are £30
 - Players' Registration fees are £2 each Referees' fees are £30 which are paid by the home club.
 - Pitch hire costs vary depending on the venue. The League hires the venues and invoices the home club after the match.
 - All teams have to be affiliated to the County FA.
- The Wiltshire FA also run a County Cup Competition for Veterans' teams.
- Last season, Melksham Town and Corsham Town contested the County Cup Final with Melksham emerging victorious.
