Safeguarding children is everyone's responsibility.

If you have personally received a disclosure, you may wish to speak with someone confidentially to help you to deal with what you have heard.

You may also feel the need to be reassured that the issues are being dealt with in the best possible way with the interests of the child or young person being paramount.

Clearly confidentiality is essential. Therefore, when seeking support or guidance from a recommended source (see page 3) you will be expected to keep the personal details (i.e. the names of individuals concerned) confidential.
